Service Options

Traditional Services: The traditional funeral service allows the survivors to express and satisfy their own emotional and psychological needs. While the funeral is about the person who has died, it is for the survivors. The funeral service helps family members and friends face the reality of the death. This is the first step toward overcoming grief. There are many ways to personalize a funeral service such as music, video tributes played at the service, displaying personal items, memory boards of pictures, floral arrangements, personal eulogies by family members, friends or minister and fraternal services are just a few of the many options available.

Memorial and Celebration of Life Services: Contrary to what most people believe, cremation does not limit a family's choices. Cremation allows the family to still have a funeral service with the casket present. Families may decide to have a memorial or celebration of life service which may or may not include having the urn present. Once cremation has taken place there are also many options for the family to consider with regards for your loved ones urn. They may include burial in a family plot, a niche in a cemetery columbarium, scattering or keeping the urn at home.

Gathering of Family and Friends: Some families may not feel the need for a formal funeral or memorial service with clergy present. Gatherings allow a family to be supported by their family and friends where they can remember the life lived by their loved one. Pictures, music and food can be arranged for as part of this offering. **Graveside Services:** For families who wish only a simple and dignified service for a ground burial of the deceased (casket or urn) with an open or private service at the cemetery.

Direct Burial or Cremation: A minimal service provided for families who want no services and only an immediate disposition of the deceased either by burial or cremation.

What is NOT included in the above minimum service costs

- Distance fees for use of our vehicles beyond 35 km
- Removal of a pacemaker required for cremation
- Taxes, Municipal Filing fees, Ontario Consumer Protection Fees
- Any disbursements that are agreed to be paid on your behalf to crematorium fee, coroner's fee, newspaper costs, etc.

- Body transfer, where more than one staff is required at coroner's office, a private residence, nursing homes, after hours, etc.
- The drafting, placing, editing of death notice
- Online death notice on our website where online condolences may be left or accessed.
- The shipping of cremated remains by Canada Post to other locations.

Basic Required Services \$1695

These service charges identified by (*) or (**) represent the necessary non-declinable services required to facilitate the disposition of a deceased person, whether by cremation or burial. This minimum service charge or parts of it are applicable to every family we serve and includes transferring the deceased from the place of death (or Coroner's Office, hospital, airport, etc.) to our holding room, where the deceased will be placed in a casket of your choosing and securely held until the necessary documentation is completed for burial or cremation, as applicable. Once the required documentation is ready (i.e. death has been registered and if applicable, the coroner's certificate for cremation has been obtained), the deceased is transferred in a service vehicle to the cemetery or crematorium at the earliest practicable opportunity or at a scheduled time, as applicable. Additional fees may apply for mileage beyond 35 km, pacemaker, radioactive implant removal, support staff, pallbearers (burial only).

Descriptions and Costs - Staffing

\$500 - Basic Consultation *

Arrangement conference with a licensed Funeral Director, including but not limited to expert advice on options to meet your needs.

\$250 - Registration and Documentation *

Completing and filing of all documents necessary to carry out the services and supplies requested, including but not limited to, death registration, burial permit, coroner's certificate for cremation, documentation necessary to ship the body out of the country. As a part of this service, we provide you with 10 Funeral Director's Proofs of Death for estate purposes, but sometimes a provincial "Death Certificate" will be necessary and is available from the Office of the Registrar General.

\$150 - Basic preparation of remains (requires Facility for preparation/embalming/shelter) *

This service is a minimum requirement. The deceased is checked for the proper hospital identification bracelets or tags and for any personal effects, which will be returned to the authorized representative, unless otherwise instructed. The body is then placed into a non-porous mortuary pouch designed to contain the remains before being placed into the selected casket or container.

\$220 - Facility for preparation/embalming/shelter *

A secure and private room used to prepare, embalm, and/or shelter the body until the time of burial, cremation, or alternative disposition. This charge applies whenever the body is in our facility. Remains held in our facility beyond a period of 48 hours, a daily body shelter fee of \$75 will apply.

\$700 - Co-ordination of rites and ceremonies (added charged for arrangements with ceremonies and visiting) **
Co-ordination of all activities, rites and ceremonies including services and supplies provided by the funeral home, as well as those provided by third party suppliers such as flowers and death notices, arrangement of audio visual, live streaming technology, website obituary, posting obituary and other social media.

\$225 - Alternative preparation of remains (requires Facility for preparation/embalming/shelter)

This service includes those described in "Basic preparation of remains" described above, plus bathing, dressing, the setting of facial features, basic hairstyling and cosmetics for identification or viewing without embalming.

\$350 - Standard embalming (requires Facility for preparation/embalming/shelter)

Embalming is the process of replacing blood and bodily fluids with chemical preservatives. It is a process of sanitation, restoration and temporary preservation. Embalming is not legally required, but may be recommended to preserve the body between the time of death and the visitation or disposition of the deceased. Our professional funeral directors will make a recommendation based on the condition of the body and expected service needs. This charge is in addition to Basic preparation of remains fee

Basic Preparation of Remains

\$500 - Complex cases: such as autopsied, accidental or undiscovered remains

\$330 - Staff services for visitation

Staff to co-ordinate and oversee up to 2½ hours for each period of visitation prior to a funeral or memorial service. This charge covers the time from the beginning of visitation up to the start of the ceremony. It includes setting up of floral arrangements, pictures, memorabilia, casket/urn), cleaning and sanitizing, answering phones, greeting and directing visitors, supervision of parking and processing donations.

\$400 - Staff services for ceremony

Staff services of a licensed funeral director and assistants to co-ordinate and oversee ceremony at our premises or off premise such as a church, hall, cemetery or other facility.

\$325 - Staff for reception

The fee for our staff required for the initial set up of the necessary equipment, assistance during the reception, receiving and arranging food, the final tear down of all equipment and clean-up

Descriptions and Costs - Facilities

\$330 - Facility for visitation (requires staff for visitation)

This is for the use of our designated facilities for each 2½ hour period of visitation held prior services. This charge is from the beginning of visitation up to the start of the ceremony, even if the ceremony is in the same room or off site location.

\$450 – Facility for ceremony or off-site setup: (requires staff services for ceremony)

Designated facilities at our Funeral Home used for the ceremony or memorial service. This fee is also applied for off-site setups of any equipment that may be required; church trucks, flower stands, lectern, vigil lamps, etc.

\$325 - Facility for reception (Requires staff for reception)

We can accommodate up to 75 people for a period of time of 3 hours. A family is welcome to bring their own food or we can arrange for catering.

Descriptions and Costs - Transportation Needs

Motor vehicle charges are for the use of the funeral home vehicles on a single occasion, such as use of our Utility/Service vehicle from the funeral home to a church not exceeding 35 kilometers or a Hearse/Coach to a cemetery not exceeding 35 kilometers from the our funeral home or other location. All vehicles used for trips in excess of 35 kilometers are subject to mileage charge of \$2.50 per kilometer

\$350 - Initial transfer of remains (35 km) - Basic: *

A professionally trained member of our staff using a properly equipped unmarked vehicle to transport the deceased into our care from a hospital or institutional setting that will allow the use of one attendant during regular hours of 8:30 am to 4:30 pm Monday to Saturday.

\$125 - After hour transportation fee (between 4:30 pm - 8:30 am)

\$450 - Initial transfer of remains (35 km) - 2 attendants *

A minimum of 2 attendants are required for transfers made from: Institutions that require 2 attendants, private residences or heavier weight issues during regular hours of 8:30 am to 4:30 pm Monday to Saturday

• \$125 - After hour transportation fee (between 4:30 pm - 8:30 am)

\$225 - General duty vehicle *

This vehicle may include any or all of the following uses: floral delivery, death registration, securing certificates locally, transporting clergy, general use, etc. and transporting remains from one place to another, for example the hospital to our premises, or from our premises to the cemetery or crematorium for distances not exceeding 35 km

\$285 – Subsequent transfers of remains (within 35 km)

To be charged each time for transfers of the casketed remains from our location to other locations such as; a church in advance of services, cemetery or crematory for final disposition, transfers to out of town funeral homes, cemeteries, airports, etc.

\$160 - Clergy, Director, Lead vehicle (Requires staff services for ceremony)

This vehicle is used for administrative errands, safely leading a funeral processions, provide transport for the funeral director and clergy to the location of service at a church, gathering location, cemetery or crematory to the place of final disposition.

\$425 - Funeral Coach

Use of this specialized vehicle includes the transportation of the casket from the funeral home to the cemetery/crematorium or to church or other place of service

Distance charge (beyond 35 km)

A distance fee is charged for transfers of deceased human remains beyond 35 km that charged at a rate of \$2.50 per kilometer back to our location

Descriptions and Costs - Other Services and Supply

\$300 - Support staff

Additional staff is needed to assist with transfers of the necessary equipment and the casketed remains to off-site funeral locations such as churches, halls or cemeteries, pallbearer assistance in advance of family arriving for services, assistance with heavier lifts, etc.

\$125 - Storage of cremated remains

This fee is charged when cremated remains are left in the care of the funeral home in excess of 30 days, to a maximum of 1 year. This fee is charged on a monthly basis.

\$250 - Family concierge

A basic assistance for families supervising off-site services themselves. A concierge can; deliver, set up flowers and urn, properly process donations left at the service location for up to 2 hours.

\$95 - Professional Hairdressing

Basic hairstyling is included with our embalming fee but if needed, we can arrange for a professional hairdresser for styling, colour, cuts, etc.

\$300 - Weekend/Holiday Surcharge

An additional charge will be applied in the event any services (visitations or funerals) are held on a weekend or statutory holiday. This fee will be charged on a per day basis. Weekend/holiday services present a variety of challenges for our staff. This surcharge assists with the additional overtime costs associated with these services.

\$225 - Delay of Interment

A charge to cover costs of re-scheduling or the holding staff and vehicles to accommodate a reception held after the services before the final interment can be held

\$300 - Advance Booking Fee

Required any time our facilities are booked for services that are to be delayed and scheduled a later date beyond 30 days.

\$300 - Scattering of cremated remains

We will scatter cremated remains in accordance with Ontario and municipal laws and by-laws on land or sea. Fees for scattering from a plane or boat will be in addition to this charge and will be discussed upon request.

\$300 - Staff for witnessing

We can co-ordinate and attend along with the family that wishes to witness the interment at a cemetery or to witness the cremation at the crematorium when there are no formal services to be held.

\$175 - Shipping and handling of cremated remains

If remains are being shipped domestically to another location, we will arrange for transport, all necessary paperwork, shipping and handling fees.

\$330 - Facility for specialized needs

The use of a private room and staff to assist and oversee traditional cedar baths, ritual washing and dressing by family and as well for a private gathering of immediate family only to view and identify the deceased (10 people maximum) for a period of 30 minutes. This does not include a ceremony or public visitation and is available on weekdays between 9:00 am – 2:30 pm only

\$100 - Surgical removal of pacemakers or other implants

This procedure is mandatory prior to cremating a body that has a pacemaker or other implant and must be carried out by a licensed funeral director and includes disposal of the device. If a person was undergoing brachytherapy using radioactive seed implant treatments before death, cremation may not be possible

\$250 - Video/Live streaming services

It is hard for many people to travel a longer distance to attend a funeral. With Live Streaming out of town friends or family can watch the services as they happen at home.

\$25 each - Archived Proof of Death Certificates

The search of older records and verification of who would be entitled to receive a certificate and the reason for a Funeral Directors Proof of Death Certificate, for deaths that occurred prior to the year 2015.

\$75 - Division of cremated remains

This filling fee is charged when an urn or jewelry is purchased from an outside supplier. We assume no responsibility for any damages that may occur

\$350 - Refundable Deposit for Cremated Remains

When human remains are to be cremated, a refundable deposit will be required. If the cremated remains are not claimed within one year of the cremation, the deposit may be used to inter the cremated remains in common ground. If the cremated remains are claimed before they are interred, the deposit will be refunded

Minimum Requirements

<u>For burial:</u> The least expensive wood casket is suitable and is required by most cemeteries' by-laws for interment, in the interest of the health and safety of the workers involved in the interment process. A metal casket may also be used for burial. A growing number of cemeteries in Ontario offer "green" burials, which may consist of interment of a body without a casket. Since there is no legal definition for a "green" burial, it varies from one cemetery to another. For more information, please speak with one of our funeral directors, or visit www.greenburialcanada.ca.

<u>For cremation:</u> A body must be presented to the crematorium in a rigid, leak-proof casket that is made of a combustible material, such as wood or cardboard with a wooden base. Caskets containing non-flammable, hazardous material or chlorinated or fiber-reinforced plastic, other than incidental metal, cannot be used for cremation. We offer a selection of inexpensive caskets below that are suitable for cremation.

<u>For cemetery:</u> You do not have to purchase a vault, unless the Medical Officer of Health has made the use of vaults and grave liners mandatory in the entire cemetery. A cemetery operator may designate a specific area in the cemetery where vaults or grave liners are required; however, the operator must have another area where vaults or grave liners are not required, so that consumers have a choice. A vault or grave liner may be recommended when there are environmental conditions such as poor drainage, or for practical or aesthetic reasons.

This casket is a specially crafted unit that facilitates an inner simple container to hold the body. The casket itself acts as a "shell" around this container making it suitable for public visitation and viewing. After a service held on our site, our staff will remove the inner container from the outer casket shell. The inner container holding the body is then transported to the place of final disposition. The outer casket is reused for a number of services held at our location. Eventually it will reach a point of wear and is replaced after a relatively small number of uses.

Cremation Expense

Bereavement Authority of Ontario Consumer Protection Fee (BAO)

A fee charged on each registered death in the Province of Ontario which is used to assist the BAO with their regulatory work in the Province of Ontario: \$30 – Burial / \$60 – Cremation



Pre-payment in advance of need:

For services that are being arranged in advance of need, we offer two funding options when prepaying services or supplies:
