





Pastor's Letter

Happy Feast of Sts. Peter & Paul: Two great Pillars of the Church Dear Parishioners of Pope St. John XXIII parish faith community,

Wish you all a very Happy feast of the saints Peter and Paul. We are blessed to celebrate it this year on Sunday. Peter was a family man, a local fisherman, uneducated and quite ordinary. From what we know about him prior to being called by Jesus, there was nothing that made him uniquely qualified to become one of the pillars of the new Church to be established by the Son of God. Jesus simply called him, and he responded. While Paul describes himself as "a Jew, born at Tarsus in Cili'cia, but brought up in this city at the feet of Gama'li-el, educated according to the strict manner of the law of our fathers, because of which he "persecuted the church of God violently and tried to destroy it". In many ways, Paul would have been seen as the most unlikely person to be chosen to be a pillar of the Church. Though each of these men would have been considered by many as very unlikely founders of the Christian Church, this is exactly what they became.

Paul, after his conversion, traveled far and wide to preach the Gospel, founding several new Churches throughout Asia Minor and Europe. Eventually he was arrested in Jerusalem, brought to Rome for trial and was beheaded. Over half of the New Testament books are attributed to Paul and half of the Acts of the Apostles detail Paul's missionary journeys. Peter's role was truly a unique one. Jesus chose to make Peter a solid foundation of immovable rock on which the Church was to be built. He stayed in Jerusalem for the most part and placed the strong foundation of the church. Each of us are called to be part of the church that Christ has founded, making worthy contributions.

Speaking of the contributions as members of the church, once again I remind those who have not responded to the ACA to consider pledging for this cause, to help our local church to continue to support the several ministries that we carry out through this funding. I also sincerely thank you for your support towards our parish and the Archdiocese.

All the priests of the Archdiocese gathered at ocean shores for the priest days last week with the Archbishop and the Auxiliary Bishops to pray, to plan and to spend time together strengthening the fraternal bound as well as purposefully design for the future of parish families. Thank you all for your prayers for the success of this event. I would wrap-up my trip to Vietnam for the mission with the youth group and will return in few days. Continue to pray for the success of this mission as well, so that our youth will grow in faith, through the care they show towards the less fortunate in other parts of the world and learn to appreciates all that God has blessed us with.

I urge you earnestly to respond to the requests of the Parish Family Advisory Committee (PFAC), your response and co-operation would help them devise the better path in moving forward as One Parish. I also thank the PFAC members for their hard work and commitment for the parish, sacrificing their time to come together, plan and propose the better way to grow as one parish. I also thank the parish staff who collaborated with them in achieving this goal. We thank all the volunteers working tirelessly in making our facilities and compound beautiful and safe. It is important as we prepare for the Centennial celebration of our parish. We thank the core team that prepares and co-ordinates everything for these great celebrations. Invite you to come forward and be part of this celebration by your donations and helping hand.

As many of you are planning your summer vacations and trips, I wish you all a blessed vacation and safe trip. Praying for everyone at this special time, to use the time wisely to bond together as family and spend quality time with one-another to strengthen the family relations. Once again thank you all for being part of this beautiful faith community. Let us support each other during hard times to grow as faith filled members.
