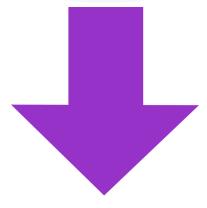
PART 1: DUMPSTER SIZE PICTURES

The first and simplest photos to capture are those of each dumpster size. These images will primarily be featured on the webpage dedicated to each specific size. The goal is to highlight the dumpster from all angles—inside and out—while showcasing its key features.

On the left side of the table, you'll find an example photo, and on the right, a brief description of what to capture.

Tips for the Best Results:

- Ensure the dumpsters are clean and well-presented.
- Choose a background that enhances your brand and doesn't distract.
- If your dumpsters are stored in a less ideal location (e.g., an overgrown lot or junkyard), consider moving them to a more polished setting for the photoshoot.

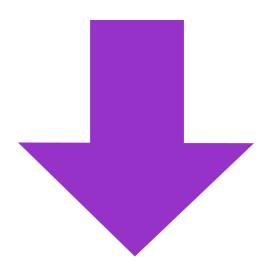

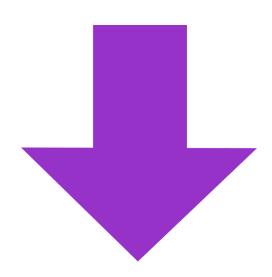
