PORTABLE LAUNDRY TRAILER
FORGED BY FIRE SERVICES | \$100,700**
Laundry Services Offered to Disaster Victims
When disaster strikes, many residents lose the means to have clean clothes. Having clean clothes plays a vital role, the same as a hot shower and warm food, in the recovery phase of a disaster. Forged by Fire Services, a District Disaster Relief Coordinator organization of the Southern District, and a Recognized Service Organization of the LCMS, is deployed predominantly in the Gulf Coast Region, sharing the hope in Christ by providing human care to the victims, volunteers, and first responders in natural disasters. This grant will help Forged by Fire Services construct a portable eight-station laundry trailer with all necessary support equipment. The trailer will service the needs of those struck by disaster in the Gulf Coast Region and surrounding LCMS Districts as requested by LCMS Disaster Response. In the aftermath of a disaster, many residents have lost their appliances, such as washers and dryers. The trailer will be deployed to the property of an LCMS congregation in the area. Free laundry services will be offered to members and the community allowing them the opportunity to wash their clothes. The laundry service will be advertised to the members of the church and the community by word of mouth and road signs. Forged by Fire Service LERT trained volunteers, who will be operating the trailer, will offer free spiritual care resources, Bibles, and personal prayers, along with a hot meal. The volunteers will be ready and willing to offer other recovery resources to those in need. This is an incredible opportunity to connect and share the love of Christ Jesus with those who are trying to recover from the loss of home and property after a natural disaster.
