

East Bay Montessori Training is for adult learners who aim to work with children ages 2 ½ to 6 years of age.

We admit adult learners with a minimum of a high school diploma or equivalent.

By completing our program you will receive either

- AMS Early Childhood Credential (Bachelor's Degree Required)
- AMS Early Childhood Associate Credential (High school or equivalent required)

For those who receive an Associate Credential, we strongly recommend completing a bachelor's degree.



Our Courses:

Philosophy and Peace

This course discusses Maria Montessori's life, influences, method, pedagogy and instruction on Peace.

Practical Life

Adult learners will explore grace and courtesy lessons, and the development and refinement of movement, care of person, care of the environment

Observation

The course discusses strategies for observation of children, documentation of behavior and learning patterns, and techniques for applying data gathered.

Sensorial

This course prepares to understand the development and refinement of the child's senses through specially-designed sensorial materials.



Language Arts

This course explores vocabulary development, receptive and expressive language experiences, visual and auditory perceptual experiences, and reading and writing development.

Physical and Life Sciences

This includes the study of Botany and Zoology, the earth's composition, and physical science.



Social Studies – Geography / History

The curriculum area of Social Studies - History and Geography is explored through the study of globes, and landforms.

Practicum (Yearlong)

Adult learners will be working in a classroom environment under a head teacher learning hands on.

Mathematics

The course will explore the mathematics area and presentations of the specially-designed math materials.

Classroom Leadership

This course explores classroom leadership, classroom management techniques, design and preparation of the child's environment.

Child Development

The adult learners will explore the theories and stages of development as it relates to a child's physical, cognitive, emotional, spiritual and social abilities.

Parent Involvement/Child, Family, and Community

This course focuses parent involvement in the child's education, raising the level of awareness of multicultural families and diversity, and their impact on a child's life.

Art, Music, and Movement

This course touches on basic art techniques and art appreciation, on music in the classroom, including the Bells, & movement activities
