Academics

MANUKURA aspires to create a student graduate profile across a matrix of skills relevant to the individual, their prior knowledge and vocational / study goals. Graduates will be connected to their iwi / hapū, engage critically with issues of importance and contribute perspectives, values and viewpoints. MANUKURA's focus continues to be on Academic Excellence, we want students displaying self-leadership through rigour in their academic learning. Our staff are focussed on learning outcomes with internal and external assessments reflecting the quality of the teaching and learning process.

MANUKURA Junior (Years 9 & 10) operate an integrated academic programme with overarching themes providing curriculum links. Developing core skills and essential knowledge is the focus at our Junior level. MANUKURA Seniors (Years 11-13) operate a Term timetable designed to maximise teaching and learning opportunities to develop skill set, confidence and competence as they work towards successful knowledge gains and assessment task completion. It is imperative for MANUKURA that we are aligned but importantly, that we ensure that our goals and aspirations are at the forefront of education design and delivery. NCEA

MANUKURA has been involved in the national discussions regarding the NCEA review since 2018 contributing to the current developments with NZQA. This strategic positioning of staff, experienced in education with a determination to place our students at the forefront of education, has enabled us to have a voice regarding the changes in the education sector. To align with the nationwide key changes and the special character and philosophy of MANUKURA, changes to the delivery of our programme began in 2020 whilst 2023 will see more adaptations to ensure we are future focussed and current in our delivery. Please use the students' full name as a reference. All fees are expected to be paid through automatic payment to ensure at the end of each Term that you are financial as a whānau. Being financial means having paid the \$625 at the end of each Term in full.

Failure to meet payments can result in Debt Collection Agency engagement or student removal from MANUKURA. Finance Manager, Lisa Davis is available to discuss these options with whānau on (06) 354 9531 or 027 297 2814 or by emailing lisa@manukura.school.nz.

The three payment options available to whanau are:

- 1. Pay \$2,500 in full prior to the beginning of the school year.
- 2. Pay \$625 prior to the beginning of each term.
- 3. Pay \$62.50 per week over 40 weeks or \$125 fortnightly by automatic payment.

Clothing & Footwear

MANUKURA chooses to allow students to wear mufti on a daily basis so everyone is comfortable when working in the learning environment. Appropriate clothing for the learning environment is important. Girls please note the subtlety of mid thigh shorts for the classroom and training shorts for the conditioning environment. Same applies to singlets and dress tops please. Footwear - gumboots are appropriate for outside work spaces but you are welcome to wear ugg boots or slippers inside the learning space in winter months particularly.

Dentist Service

All appointments need to be made by students ideally outside of the MANUKURA timetable hours. Carpenters Dental has been a regular service provider however individuals are welcome to continue with their own Dentist if preferred. Please make dentist details known to MANUKURA by contacting admin@manukura.school.nz.

Doctors

Any specific medical information is valuable to have for managing individual needs. If all whānau can please ensure students are enrolled with a local Doctor in Palmerston North then that will be helpful in assisting them when medical needs arise. Please make medical details known to MANUKURA by contacting admin@manukura.school.nz.

Hydration & Nutrition

With the aspiration of high performance in academics, culture and sport it is important that your body is well cared for. We provide breakfast and lunch with a clear focus on ensuring that this has nutritional value and is consumed at appropriate times to assist with both recovery and readiness for academic learning and performance needs.

Knowing what your body needs and what your body wants takes time but is a pursuit worth chasing. Make sure you are aware of the amount of water intake your body requires to complete a good training and recovery programme. In addition, great exercise will be quickly undone if quality food intake is not aligned.

Mobile phones

We are comfortable with students having these on site each day however they are collected before SB1 and returned before SB5. No mobile phone use is permitted during academic timeframes or independent

learning time unless staff permission is granted. All phones are locked away for safety. Honesty in the use of devices is an expected code of conduct.

Massey University

We are fortunate to be based near the Massey University campus where we lease building space impossible to replicate on a small budget. This includes the Recreation Centre, Gymnasium, and other facilities within our vicinity. All Massey University facilities are only accessible during the school term under MANUKURA supervision.

Private Cars

Students are able to bring a private car to MANUKURA if they are on their restricted or full licence. If students are on their restricted licence, they are NOT permitted to carry any student passengers at ANY time. This includes travel to and from school or school associated events. A photocopy of their licence will need to be given to the MANUKURA office so they have a record on site. Parking is permitted in the public parking area of the Hokowhitu Campus car park. MANUKURA expects high standards of responsibility from both the student and whānau in respect of private car management. Breaches of the law regarding student conduct in private cars will be brought to whānau attention.

Self-Directed Learning

MANUKURA requires all students to develop strong self-directing skills. Academic study blocks are working times where students are either in a tutorial or independent learning time (ILT). Planning is essential and this is a process regularly reviewed by students and Year Group Leads collectively based on the individual goals and needs of each student. Academic targets are set and reviewed for each individual student. Meeting academic targets is essential and if academic loading is not managed students will be withdrawn from MANUKURA practices, conditioning and/or games/tours until this is met to the expected standard.

Being connected and successful as an academic and athlete is the expected norm. Developing the necessary skills of planning, researching, reading and questioning are critical components for success. Academic delivery for students at MANUKURA is through MANUKURA employed teaching & ancillary staff and can be both on and off site relative to the course studied.

Whānau Links

Whānau are a critically important support and guidance role for all students. First and foremost is ensuring students are in full attendance daily to maximise the opportunities on offer.

We appreciate you making contact to discuss students' progress and development and will conduct whānau chats as specified in the MANUKURA 2023 Calendar. In addition, all students will create and update their individual website which you will have access to. This website allows you to review regularly the progress your child is making in all areas of MANUKURA life. The student website will be our formal reporting mechanism so you will know at all times your child's goals, learning journey, teacher feedback and curricular activity progress as it occurs through their individual website. The student website is a special 'window' into their MANUKURA world. Material on the website will be supported each week by PIP (Personal Improvement Plan) Mentors who guide and support student progress with a weekly meeting on a Friday with their designated student group.

The KAMAR parent portal provides additional links so you are able to update changes to your child's personal details, medical records, view NCEA progress and the like. We welcome your contact with the Year Group Leads and/or the Leadership Team at any time throughout the year if you have any feedback, concerns or queries. Special Character: 'Cultivating a culture of Excellence'

MANUKURA is a state secondary special character kaupapa. This reflects our desire to provide a model of learning that challenges the norms and current expectations of Māori learners. Be it academics, cultural competency, performance sport - we expect they are all coupled with Excellence in delivery. It is critically important that we work to raise the standards of performance across all areas each year. In sport this will mean meeting fitness testing criteria, increased expectation on performance improvement and a deep commitment to living a performance lifestyle.

MANUKURA Sport

HIGH PERFORMANCE SPORT at MANUKURA

Athlete focused, coach led, performance driven.

The Government invests in high performance sport for the many benefits it brings to the whole country, including the national pride we feel when we see New Zealanders standing on the podium. Our most successful athletes act as role models, and their performances add fuel to the dreams of others. They also inspire other New Zealanders to be successful, whether this is in sport or other endeavours. Having New Zealanders winning on the world stage builds identity and promotes New Zealand as a successful nation internationally.

High Performance Sport NZ Strategic Plan

This is the mantle of High Performance Sport New Zealand and one in which we at MANUKURA embrace. Our main focus is to grow people through sport using it as a catalyst to achieve academic and sporting success always with the focus of being successful Māori role models as a key ingredient. Our goal is to identify and develop sporting talent, and ensure athletes have the skills and resources they need to produce, nurture and support their academic and sporting aspirations.

Creating a performance driven environment where high expectations challenge all personnel to reflect the aspirations of MANUKURA is a constant. Sports science is one of the many areas the programme encompasses into the daily expectations of the athletes lives. MANUKURA aims for all students to live a performance lifestyle and therefore behaviours that detract from this lifestyle are not tolerated.

- § We believe in fair play
- § We believe in providing opportunities for all to develop performance depth and growth
- § We believe in fostering the self-esteem and respect of both self and others
- § We believe in quality learning experiences that extend, challenge and grow individuals
- § We believe in providing opportunities in which students can achieve personal success
- § We believe in reflecting positively the aspirations of Māori success the MANUKURA way
- § We believe in committing to a high-performance lifestyle
- § We believe in creating an environment where high expectation is paramount

For 2023 all students have been asked to identify their sporting preference in order so we are able to target our resources in ensuring students maximise their opportunities and importantly grow their skill set and capacity. **Performance and Participation** sporting cohorts will be formulated based on:

- 1 **Fitness Testing** results (meeting standards set by sporting playing position)
- 2 **Capacity** (technical and tactical capability in their nominated sporting code)
- 3 Commitment (attendance in conditioning/school/events, completion of monitoring tasks)

Term 1 will be a combination of conditioning combined with skill sessions to provide opportunities for students to demonstrate whether they are in the Performance or Participation Programme. From here sport trials will be held to ensure accurate placement of individuals to ensure extension and growth is achieved.

It is critical that the Summer Conditioning Programme is completed to a high intensity to ensure students can sustain the requirements of the performance sport model MANUKURA desires.

MANUKURA Pride

High Performance Sport and Cultural Representation at MANUKURA demands the highest standards of conduct and reflection. The MANUKURA way expects all personnel to reflect strongly on all aspects of MANUKURA representation. Individuals representing MANUKURA accept their role in being best prepared for the role they play, in expecting the best of others and in always seeking to grow.

MANUKURA Management

All MANUKURA sport personnel are volunteers giving their time, expertise and experience for the betterment of growing individuals through sport. Respect for their specific roles and decisions is an important aspect of the programme. Any queries should be directed to the Coach/Code Lead in the first instance then to the Principal where the situation necessitates.

MANUKURA Uniforms

All uniform items that carry the MANUKURA logo are loaned out to personnel for their specific sporting and cultural events. These loan items are to be worn only by the individual they are loaned to, and to events in which that person is directly involved as a player/performer or management member. No items with the MANUKURA logo are available for purchase to ensure the reflection of MANUKURA is managed appropriately by those directly representing MANUKURA.

All teams/individuals representing MANUKURA must wear the full and correct attire for the event at all times they are representing MANUKURA. Wearing full uniform items to and from events includes appropriate footwear. We believe uniform is a strong reflection of attitude, character and the pride you have in who and what you represent, therefore conduct whilst wearing such items needs to be of the highest standards. Specific uniform items required for each event will be directed by the person in charge of that particular group. Please care for, and return all MANUKURA loan items as requested. Charges at replacement cost will be made to individuals for any non-returns.

Non-compliance can lead to the removal of students from sporting and cultural events/programmes.

To ensure all personnel involved understand the expectations of them as MANUKURA representatives, codes of conduct are articulated below:

MANUKURA PLAYERS' Code of Conduct

- § Play for the learning and development sport offers.
- § Play with passion but play by the rules.
- § Never argue with officials' decisions. Let your captain or coach ask any necessary questions at appropriate times.
- § Recognise positive contributions made by teammates' and opposition.
- § Treat all players as you would like to be treated.
- § Cooperate with your coach, teammates' and opponents, for without them you don't have a game.
- § Contribute to your own, and the teams progress, by being a self responsible, self reflective and self driven athlete.
- § Live the high-performance lifestyle: quality nutrition & hydration, conditioning, sleep, recovery, and attitude.

MANUKURA WHĀNAU Code of Conduct

- § Embrace the MANUKURA way.
- § Encourage and support a high-performance lifestyle.
- § Teach your child that honest effort is as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment and a focus on learning is always evident.
- § Turn defeat into victory and victory into further learning by helping your child develop confidence in accurate and regular self-reflection.
- § Remember that athletes learn best by example. Comments from the sideline need to be unbiased and positive.
- § Do not question the officials' judgment. The official is always right.

MANUKURA SPECTATORS' Code of Conduct

- § Support is an essential part of development of athletes
- § Applaud good play by your own team and the opposition.
- § Show respect for your team's opponents. Without them there would be no games.
- § Never ridicule or scold a child for making a mistake during a game.
- § Condemn the use of violence in all forms.
- § Respect the referee's decision.
- § Encourage players to play according to the rules.
- § Any inappropriate behaviour reflects badly on yourself, the team and MANUKURA.

MANUKURA COACHES' Code of Conduct

- § Players need a coach that they can respect. Be generous with your praise when it is deserved and set a good example in all areas such as attire, language, expectations, punctuality and expertise.
- § Ensure that all players are given the opportunities to perform and grow.
- § Develop team respect for the judgment of officials.
- § Follow the advice of a doctor in determining when an injured player is fit to play again.
- § Insist on fair and disciplined play, do not tolerate foul play, fighting or bad language. Be prepared to take the offending player out of the competition environment.
- § Role model MANUKURA ethos, standards and expectations in all that you do.

Representative Sport

It is an expectation at MANUKURA that players make themselves available for Representative selections. Representative sport is considered a critical learning opportunity in high performance sport and as such can lead to further development opportunities at regional and/or national level. MANUKURA works closely with the local sporting bodies to ensure the programmes align and support the development of players both now and in the future. Fees associated with participation in all Representative Teams is an individual player cost and therefore not linked to school fundraising which is for MANUKURA sport specifically. Please communicate your intentions with the Code Lead and/or Principal if you are intending playing outside Manawatū before you make commitments.

MANUKURA Sports Codes

We use sport as a catalyst to drive excellence in all areas of students' lives. The sports we are able to offer specific support and growth in currently are Basketball, Netball, Rugby League, Rugby Union, Rugby Sevens, Touch Rugby and Waka Ama. Athletes with strengths in other sporting codes are expected to manage their programmes with the support of their whanau, specialist coach along with a dedicated MANUKURA Staff member for support. Please communicate your intentions with the Code Lead and/or Tūmuaki if you are intending playing outside of MANUKURA Sport before you make commitments.

NZSSSC - School Team Eligibility criteria

A school team eligible to compete in National and Island secondary school events must not exceed the quota of students new to the school in the 2 years preceding the first day of the event as specified in the table below.
