

Useful Repentance

First Prayer of Confession (unison)

From being satisfied with things as they are, in the Church or in the world; from failing to share the pain and sorrow of injustice not addressed; from selfishness, indulgence, or self-pity; Holy One, deliver us.

From token concern for others, rich or poor, from disdain for lonely or loveless people; from confusing faith with feeling justified, or love with wanting to be loved; Holy One, deliver us.

For everything in us that may hide your light, giving us permission to neglect the help you would give us; Holy One, let this be the acceptable time for you to forgive us, set us free, and heal our hearts and minds, Amen.


