The Fourth Advent Candle:

LOYE

It's only a few more days until Christmas!

Today we can light all four candles around the wreath: but not the white candle!

'Hope', 'Peace', and 'Joy'—today the circle is completed with 'Love'!

Love is where hope and peace and joy are leading us. The hope, peace and joy candles are re-lit, the remaining (purple) advent candle is lit...

Isaiah said that the child born for us would be called 'Emmanuel'

That name for the Messiah, 'Emmanuel', means "God with us".

We know God is with us when we feel love: because God is love!

When Jesus is born, Jesus is Emmanuel—God with us, helping us.

We believe that Jesus was born so that we would know God loves us all!


