YOUTH & CAREER SERVICES

CAREER EXPLORATION THROUGH BUSINESS TOURS

In just three years, our Youth & Career Services team empowered over 350 students with the skills, exposure, and confidence to succeed beyond high school. Through 12 dynamic career 20+ tours, business camps, and statewide college visits. students explored real-world industries and postsecondary pathways. With a 99% graduation rate and over \$200,000 in scholarships awarded, our impact is preparing the clear: we're next generation to lead, innovate, and thrive.



HANDS-ON CAREER EXPLORATION THROUGH VR CAREER CAMPS

Students participate in hands-on culinary training during one of our Vocational Rehabilitation Career Camps, where they explore real-life job skills in supportive, inclusive environments. These camps help youth build independence, confidence, and workplace readiness.

One of our students proudly participated in Royal Caribbean's Disability Mentoring Day, gaining valuable career exposure and one-on-one mentorship in a professional setting. Experiences like this empower our youth to envision inclusive futures in competitive industries.

VOCATIONAL SERVICES 2020-2023




EMPOWERING STUDENTS TO ACHIEVE WORKFORCE SUCCESS

Our vocational program empowers youth with disabilities to explore career pathways, develop practical job skills, and prepare for independent employment. In partnership with Vocational Rehabilitation, we provide individualized support, hands-on training, and real-world experiences that help students transition confidently into the workforce.



From 2020 to 2023, our vocational services supported **314** students in securing meaningful employment, equipping them with the skills, training, and guidance needed to succeed in today's workforce.

HOUSING SERVICES 2020-2023



EMPOWERING INDEPENDENCE THROUGH HOUSING SUPPORT

At CIL Broward, our housing program provides critical support to individuals and seeking families accessible, and sustainable living solutions. From 2020 to 2023, we assisted over **1,170** consumers with resources, placement assistance, barrier removal, planning, and credit guidance, empowering to them overcome obstacles and achieve greater independence.

DID YOU KNOW:

Nearly **60%** of people with disabilities in Broward County live below the ALICE threshold, meaning they struggle to afford basic needs, while **74%** of those renters are cost-burdened, paying more than **35%** of income on housing

INFORMATION & REFERRAL SERVICES




From 2020 to 2023, CIL Broward responded to **17,684** Information & Referral (I&R) requests, guiding individuals and families to the resources they need most. Whether it's housing, healthcare, employment, or accessibility services, our I&R program ensures consumers are connected quickly and effectively, removing barriers and empowering them to take their next steps toward independence.

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY 2020-2023

EMPOWERING INDEPENDENCE THROUGH ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY

At CIL Broward, our Assistive Technology program helps individuals with disabilities gain access to tools that promote independence, communication, and mobility. From 2020 to 2023, we supported **567** consumers with devices, training, and resources that break down barriers and improve quality of life.





DID YOU KNOW?

Studies show that workers with disabilities who receive assistive-technology accommodations are significantly more likely to be employed, with just 3-4% of employees typically receiving such equipment, yet prompting meaningful employment gains

ADA & STAFF CELEBRATION








PROJECT SEARCH
