# Pastor's Tidbits

A very old Chinese man named Sai had only one son and one horse. One day the horse ran away and Sai was very worried. Only one horse, and now it was lost! Someone said, "Don't suffer, wait a little." The horse eventually came back.

Not long after this, Sai's only son learned to ride the horse. While returning home one day, he fell from the horse and broke his leg. Poor Sai was very sorrowful! He could not eat, nor sleep. Only one son, and now crippled! But someone said, "More patience, Sai!"

Soon after the accident a war broke out. All the young men went to war; none of them returned. Only Sai's son, the cripple, stayed at home and remained alive to his father's joy.

Romans 8:28 states, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." (NIV) It's easy to read this one verse out of its context and apply it to old Sai and his crippled son in the illustration above and say that all the things they faced ultimately worked for their good.

However, the Bible verse clarifies the established fact ("we know") that in all things (the good, bad and ugly), God works for the good, not of all people, but "of those who love Him".

Not those who love the idea of a God, not those who ardently profess that they love God, but those who love God every moment of every day as they live in a loving and obedient relationship with Jesus. These are the true believers who have accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord, Master and Savior.

God works for the good of such believers.

Now each of us understands "good" in our own special way. I may call a spicy Indian curry 'good', while some of you may think I'm crazy.

If we love God and are called according to His purpose, God does not work all things according to our subjective definition of good.

In the next verse (Rom. 8:29) Paul explains the ultimate good that God is using all things for in a true believer. "For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers."

God uses 'all things' to transform a true believer to Christlikeness. God allows circumstances, especially the difficult ones, to come into a true believer's life to ultimately develop the character of Jesus in him/her.

This is a continuing activity of God (literally, God continues to work for the good), that He keeps on doing for our good and His glory.

But if we love God and are called according to His purpose, what's the proof that God truly loves us so much that He continually works all things for our good?

Look down a few verses to verse 32: "He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?"

If God loved us enough to send Jesus to suffer His wrath for our sins; if God loved us enough to allow Jesus to pay the price for our sins and to die the death we justly deserved, "how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?"

As we travel with Jesus towards His cross during this Passion Week, as we witness Jesus nailed to the cross and dying there for us on Good Friday, may we come to truly believe in Him as our Lord, Savior and Master. Then, as we continue to love God, and live in a loving, obedient relationship with Jesus every day, God will continually work all things for our good and for His glory!

### **BIC Atlantic Conference**

The Atlantic Conference of the BIC Church met recently at the Free Grace Church in Millersburg, PA with 3 delegates representing our congregation. Under the theme TOGETHER, 200 delegates representing 38 churches with an average attendance of 7500. Delegates traveled from geographical regions east of the Susquehanna River to Philadelphia, NY, Del, and NJ. We met for worship and discussed the state of the church.

Group session revealed what churches are excited about and what they are struggling with. Some celebrating gratitude, and some dealing with grief are still trying to recuperate from the Covid years and remembering the way it used to be. While the church keeps its eyes on Jesus and follows faithfully the cultural pressures, then and now issues, shifting political winds, and differing opinions on life choices that have been impacting the togetherness of the church.

Positively the Holy Spirit guidance has been influencing the BIC Church for almost 250 years. With Jesus centered interpretation of scripture, the encouragement of people, and sharing of faith, 5 new churches have been started helping to meet needs in the past year.

As National Director of the 7 districts across the US, Alan Robinson said "there are ongoing discussions of the cultural shifts in society, the impact of political climates and elections, and we see ourselves as exiles wrestling with consistency and how our values are shaped." And so, while we are in the world, may our lives let people see Jesus through us. Every time present I am impacted by the kindness of this denomination.
