PRAY FOR VOCATIONS

Christ trusts His apostles to reveal and introduce "salvation" to all of His people; He calls us in a personal way, awarding us redemption

and conversion. Such a mission implies the social transformation of the human race. The modern priest must play both a father and a teacher role. Not everyone can carry out such a demanding task; nor is it a responsibility that can be easily mastered. We are being called now, more than ever, "the harvest is great."

Brothers and Sisters,

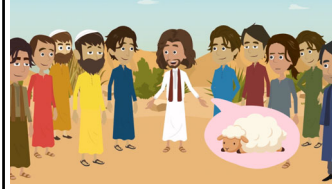
Today's Gospel recounts Christ with His generous mercy, who is moved when seeing His people "abandoned and exhausted", like sheep that have no shepherd. It is in that situation the Church finds itself in today for "the harvest is plentiful and the laborers are few." We need priests! Why have vocations diminished? What has happened to our world? It is obvious that materialism has invaded the home and the school grounds; as well as the economy, the political arena and our work places.

The family obsesses about its financial well-being, their "social status". Learning institutions are but conduits of information, rather than developing virtuous traits and community. The youth are motivated by the practical and useful, seeking comforts; the standard of a disposable society. Thus, we cannot be surprised by the following conclusion from this Gospel reading: The harvest is plentiful and growing, but the laborers are few, and declining. Yet there is a deeper cause for concern: "modern man has expelled God from their daily lives."

1. Jesus Christ's primary directive is 'prayer': "Pray to the Lord of the harvest to provide the laborers to gather His crop." The Church will grow vibrantly if the community of believers is solid and well-instructed in religious doctrine. One of the most serious shortcomings of modern Christians is religious ignorance. Formation must be nurtured. Our contemporary world demands from its Christians "to supply rationale for their faith." But "nobody can provide what they themselves do not have." Our prayer must remain strong: "Lord, send us saints and holy priests that reflect your heart."

2. His second recommendation describes the distinctiveness of the Christian life: "We have received it free, thus should share it freely." Every Christian is a "Gift from God" to his fellow brothers and we all should follow the unselfish example of Jesus Christ who surrendered His life; His death on the cross for the salvation of all men. It is imperative that we teach our youth so through Christ's generosity both the quality and quantity "of shepherds to tend to His sheep will multiply." We must pray fervently to our Lord for vocations and educate our children about generosity so they will recognize the call of a life to God. The entire community that supports them will treasure them like vessels of clay. Amen.

REZAR POR LAS VOCACIONES

Cristo confía a sus apóstoles la tarea de anunciar a todas las gentes la salvación, los llama y los envía en forma personal,

otorgándoles poderes de sanación corporal y de conversión. Esta misión implica la transformación social del mundo. El sacerdote de nuestro tiempo tiene que ser a la vez padre y maestro. No cualquiera puede asumir esa tarea, ni es una responsabilidad que se improvisa. Hace falta ser llamado y enviado y ahora más que nunca "la mies es mucha".

Hermanas y hermanos:

1.- El Evangelio de hoy nos muestra a un Cristo lleno de misericordia que se conmueve al ver a las gentes "extenuadas y abandonadas, como ovejas que no tienen pastor". Es el mismo panorama que contempla también hoy la Iglesia porque "la mies es mucha y los obreros pocos". ¡Hacen falta sacerdotes! ¿Por qué disminuyen las vocaciones? ¿Qué puede estar sucediendo? Es evidente que el materialismo ha invadido el hogar y la escuela, la economía, la política y el trabajo.

La familia se preocupa por el bienestar, el "status social". El colegio busca transmitir información, más que formar en la virtud y en la convivencia. Los jóvenes se mueven por lo útil, lo más cómodo, el criterio de lo desechable. Entonces no pueden asombrarnos las conclusiones de este Evangelio: "La mies es mucha y será cada vez mayor, y los obreros pocos, y serán cada vez menos". Sin embargo hay otra causa más profunda y anterior: el hombre moderno ha expulsado a Dios de su vida.

2.- La primera recomendación que Cristo nos hace es la oración: "Rogad al dueño de la mies, que envíe operarios a su mies". La Iglesia será vigorosa si la comunidad de los creyentes es sólida y está bien formada en las verdades religiosas. Una de las carencias más graves del cristiano de nuestro tiempo es la ignorancia religiosa. La formación no se suple con nada. El mundo a nuestro alrededor tiene derecho a exigir de los cristianos "que den razones de su fe". Pero "nadie da lo que no tiene". Nuestra oración debe seguir siendo: "Señor, danos santos y sabios sacerdotes según tu corazón".

3.- La segunda recomendación de Jesús marca el estilo de la vida cristiana: "Lo habéis recibido gratis, dadlo gratis". Cada cristiano es "gracia de Dios" para sus hermanos y debe entregarse con corazón amplio a ejemplo de Jesucristo que se entregó a sí mismo hasta la muerte y muerte de cruz para la salvación de todos los hombres. Hemos de educar a nuestros jóvenes a la generosidad para que crezca el número y la calidad de los "pastores que se ocupen de las ovejas". Pidamos a Dios por las vocaciones y eduquemos a nuestros hijos en la generosidad para que puedan percibir el llamado divino. Ellos y toda la comunidad que los sostiene llevamos un tesoro en vasos de barro. Amén.

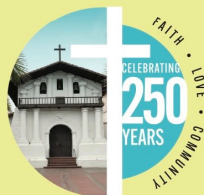
