If You Wish to Follow Me...

The Apostle is a faithful reflection of Christ. As we read today's Gospel we are struck by the radical demands Christ makes. He is the Lord,

the absolute value, the supreme good, the treasure and the priceless pearl which merits the selling of everything else. Neither family, nor health and wellbeing, nor life itself should occupy the first place in our heart, because that place belongs to God. Following Christ is a free, committed response.

Sisters and Brothers,

1. Being worthy of Christ means being conscious of own faith and coherent with the its moral demands. The life of a saint is nothing more than the story of someone who learns to think like Christ, to feel like Christ, to live like Christ. The more we imitate Christ, the more worthy we become. The more we carry God in our hearts, the more we realize that we are in God's heart.

Often we think we are Christians just because of our appearance, or our clothes, or because our name is written in the parish registries. But saying we are Christian and not living like it makes life counterproductive and sterile.

2. Through the sacrament of baptism we are incorporated into Christ's evangelizing mission. As Christians we are called to live a new life that changes all our human plans and focuses all our thoughts until everything around us begins to revolve around the establishment of Christ's Kingdom in the world. A Christian's feet should be firmly planted on the earth, but his heart must be in Heaven with God. A Christian incarnates God's smile by living with delicate charity and motivating all those around him to give themselves fully to God and neighbor. Can I say that I live out my call to be an apostle in the midst of the world around me? Have I become the smile of God for my neighbors? Do those around me discover in how good it must be to live for God?

3. Our society needs men and women who show that true happiness does not consist in having more and more things. Our society needs those who remind us that we are not rich when we have many things, but when we know how to enjoy them simply and share them generously. We are not rich when we have a lot, but when we need very little. As the saying goes, "There was once a man so very, very poor, that all he had was money."

On judgment day we will be judged by our love. How terrible it would be to find myself before Christ, hearing him asking for an account of my life, and having nothing to show him but empty hands! St. Teresa of Avila said it well: "At the end of the day, the one who is saved knows, and the one who is not, knows nothing." Mother Teresa used to say, "faith is poverty; poverty is freedom; freedom is joy!" Only the ones who follow Christ and leave everything else behind to make him the center of their lives are capable of proclaiming new life to today's world. Only they will leave behind a legacy of love and present themselves to God with hands full of good works.

"Si quieres seguirme..."

El apóstol es el reflejo fiel de Cristo. Leyendo el Evangelio de hoy llama la atención la exigencia radical de Cristo. Es el Señor, el valor absoluto,

el bien supremo, el tesoro y la perla preciosa por el cual vale la pena venderlo todo. Ni la familia, ni la salud o el bienestar, ni la vida misma pueden ocupar el primer puesto en nuestro corazón, porque pertenece a Dios. El seguimiento de Jesucristo es una respuesta comprometida y voluntaria.

Hermanas y hermanos:

1. Ser digno de Cristo es ser consciente de la propia fe y ser coherente en la vida moral que se lleva. La vida de los santos no es sino la historia de una identificación con Cristo en su modo de pensar, de sentir, de expresarse y de vivir. Cuanto mejor imitan a Cristo más dignos se encuentran; cuanto más llevan a Dios en su corazón, más se dan cuenta que están ellos en el corazón de Dios.

Muchas veces nos sentimos cristianos sólo por la apariencia exterior, la inscripción en los registros parroquiales o la forma de vestir. Pero decirse cristiano y no serlo llega a ser contraproducente y estéril.

2. Por el sacramento del bautismo quedamos incorporados a Cristo en su misión evangelizadora. Para el cristiano comienza una vida nueva que revoluciona todos sus planes humanos, polariza sus pensamientos hasta tal punto que todo lo que lo rodea comienza a girar en torno al establecimiento de su Reino en el mundo.

El cristiano debe tener los pies bien asentados en la tierra y el corazón puesto en las cosas de Dios. El cristiano encarna la sonrisa de Dios con su caridad delicada y motiva a los que lo rodean para la entrega total a Dios y a sus hermanos. ¿Puedo decir que ya vivo mi condición de apóstol en mi medio ambiente? ¿Me he convertido en la sonrisa de Dios para mis hermanos? ¿Los que me ven pueden descubrir con facilidad el "talante" de los hombres de Dios?

3. Esta sociedad necesita hombres y mujeres, que sepan demostrar que la felicidad no consiste en acumular bienes. Necesita que alguien le recuerde que no somos ricos cuando poseemos muchas cosas, sino cuando sabemos disfrutarlas con sencillez y compartirlas con generosidad. Que no somos ricos cuando tenemos mucho, sino cuando necesitamos poco. Como dicen en la calle: "era un hombre tan pobre, tan pobre, que no tenía más que dinero"

En el día del juicio seremos juzgados por el amor. ¡Qué tremendo será encontrarme con Cristo que me pide cuentas y yo no tenga nada que decirle sino mostrarle mis manos vacías! Bien decía Santa Teresa: "Al final de la jornada el que se salva sabe y el que no, no sabe nada". La Madre Teresa de Calcuta decía certeramente: "La fe es pobreza; la pobreza es libertad; la libertad es alegría". Solamente quien sigue a Jesucristo, dejando todas las demás cosas y teniéndolo a Él como centro de su vida, es capaz de anunciar una vida nueva al mundo de hoy, dejar una huella de caridad y presentarse al juicio de Dios con las manos llenas de buenas obras.

The Curator's Corner:

On June 27, 1776, Father Palou relates: "The expedition arrived near its destination. The commander, therefore, ordered the camp to be pitched on the bank of a lagoon which Senor Anza had named Nuestra Señora de los Dolores, and which is in sight of the Ensenada de los Llorones, and of the bay or arm of the sea that extends to the southeast. Here, all were to await the transport ship to mark out the site on which to locate the fort and the presidio while the country was being explored.

In his Vida, Father Palou is a little more explicit. There, he notes: "On the day after our arrival, the commander ordered an enramada (arbor) to be constructed, which was to serve as a chapel for celebrating the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. On an altar erected within, I celebrated the first Holy Mass on June 29th, the feast of the great Holy Apostles Peter and Paul. My companion continued celebrating Holy Mass there every day for an entire month.

Hence, June 29, 1776, five days before the Declaration of Independence, is the date of the First Mass offered at what would become the Mission dedicated to Our Seraphic Father Saint Francis of Assisi.

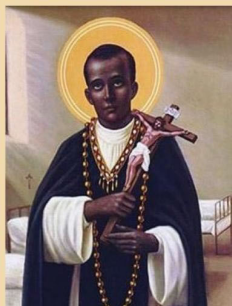
