MEEK AND HUMBLE OF HEART

For a Christian, strength is found in weakness. Our teacher is Jesus Christ, and he wants us to learn from Him to be meek and humble of heart.



The world may brush the simple aside and call them ignorant, but Jesus' prayer to his Father teaches us to value the greatness of the little ones among us. God himself chose them to be preachers of Divine Wisdom.

Sisters and Brothers:

1. It was the humiliation of Christ that brought about the salvation of man. The people of Israel had different expectations for the Messiah, but Jesus simplified the path by his way of doing things. He presents himself as a humble king, a meek king. He strips himself of any aura of greatness; he makes himself small and lives among the forgotten, among those who are hidden from the eyes of the world. He chooses them to be guardians of the secret salvation. The most noble of all teachings were brought to the world by a handful of simple fishermen. They began the most transcendent social transformation in history.

2. The beatitudes announce "blessed are the poor, the humble, the imprisoned, the sick, the suffering, the weeping. Throughout the centuries many saints have changed history with their simple projects: Francis of Assisi, called the "poverello" – little poor one; Therese of Lisieux, who proposed "the little way" in her autobiography, "The Story of a Soul"; Mother Teresa of Calcutta, "the angel of the lepers." True freedom, true joy, and true beauty are found in the mystery of simple souls. Only in this way can we call ourselves disciples of Christ who was "meek and humble of heart."

Mother Mary gave us the same example. God chose the simplest of women, the most humble and the most pure, to carry out the most sublime mission. Mary took these guidelines of humility and simplicity that God had given her and made them the absolute measure of all her actions. And so she became the key to the story of salvation.

3. Man is transformed when he draws near to Christ with a humbled spirit. There was once a woman and a mother who, after years and years of terrible physical and moral suffering, suddenly understood that God was calling her to be a good Christian in the simple things, like prayer and the sacraments and Sunday mass. Now her cross feels like an "easy yoke." This woman used to always be angry and frustrated with her children, annoyed by their crying and wanting her own will in all things. When she understood that she was called to be humble and to spread goodness, then she realized that her cross weighed less.

If a man is religious, he must also be humble, for as St. Teresa of Avila teaches, "humility is truth." A proud Christian is a contradiction in terms. The "Magnificat" that Mary sung at the annunciation proclaims the humility of God's handmaid, and at the same time celebrates the great things that God has done in her. True freedom, true joy, and true beauty are found in the mystery of simple souls.

MANSOS Y HUMILDES

La fuerza del cristiano se encuentra en la debilidad.

Nuestro maestro es Jesucristo y quiere que aprendamos de Él a ser mansos y humildes de corazón.



El mundo tacha de ignorantes a los sencillos, pero la oración de Jesús a su Padre nos ayuda a valorar la grandeza de los pequeños. Dios mismo los elige para que prediquen la sabiduría divina.

Hermanas y hermanos:

1. La salvación de la humanidad se ha realizado gracias a la humillación de Jesucristo. El pueblo de Israel tenía otras expectativas pero Jesucristo le simplificó el camino con su modo de proceder. El se presenta como un rey humilde, un rey manso; se despoja de toda aura de grandeza; se hace pequeño, vive cerca de los olvidados y, a los que despreciaba el mundo, los elige para ser guardianes del secreto de la salvación. Las enseñanzas más nobles fueron transmitidas al mundo a través de unos sencillos pescadores. Ellos comenzaron la transformación social más trascendental de la historia.

2. Las bienaventuranzas proclaman felices a los pobres, los humildes, los encarcelados, los enfermos, los que sufren, los que lloran. A lo largo de los siglos ha habido santos que han cambiado la historia de su tiempo con proyectos muy simples: Francisco de Asís "il poverello"; Teresa de Lisieux que nos propone "su caminito" en la historia de un alma, Teresa de Calcuta "el ángel de los leprosos". La verdadera libertad, la verdadera alegría, la belleza más auténtica está en el misterio de las almas sencillas. Solamente así podremos llamarnos discípulos de Cristo que fue humilde y manso de corazón. Este fue también el ejemplo de María. La más sencilla de las mujeres, la más humilde y pura fue elegida por Dios para la misión más sublime. Estas pautas de humildad y sencillez que Dios le pone las asume como normas de comportamiento que le permiten convertirse en la clave de la historia de la salvación.

3. El hombre se transforma cuando se acerca a Cristo con espíritu humilde. Conoció a una madre de familia que después de dos años de terribles sufrimientos físicos y morales, entendió que Dios la llamaba a ser buena cristiana a través de las cosas sencillas como la oración, los sacramentos, la Misa dominical. Ahora siente su cruz como "un yugo suave". Esta mujer era agresiva con sus hijos, imponía sus propios derechos, se atormentaba cuando los niños lloraban, pero cuando entendió que tenía que ser humilde y repartir bondad, entonces se dio cuenta de que la cruz le pesaba menos".

El hombre religioso no puede no ser humilde porque como enseña Teresa de Ávila: "La humildad es la verdad". Un cristiano soberbio es una contradicción en sus mismos términos. El "Magnificat" que canta la Virgen en la anunciación "proclama la humildad de esclava y al mismo tiempo celebra las grandezas realizadas por Dios en ella". La verdadera libertad, la verdadera alegría, la belleza más auténtica está en ese misterio de las almas sencillas.

The Curator's Corner:

Junipero Serra and George Washington

The bronze likeness of Saint Junipero Serra, located in Statuary Hall of the nation's Capitol, appropriately faces the one depicting George Washington. Surely there was something more than coincidence in the proximity of the two great pioneers, one the "Father of his Country," the other a "Father of his Church." George Washington (1732-1799) and Junipero Serra (1713-1784) were contemporaries in ideals as well as in time. They worked for a common cause each in his own sphere. In 1776, the year associated with the Declaration of Independence, Saint Junipero Serra established the Mission of San Francisco beside the Golden Gate. By the time of his death, less than a decade later, a new nation had been born. While George Washington and his patriots fought for independence, Saint Junipero introduced Christianity into an area that would eventually join forces as the thirty-first member of the American commonwealth. At that time, the area between the Pacific and Atlantic Oceans was populated by numerous Native American Tribes and a few French colonies.

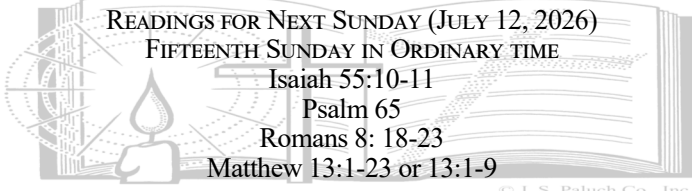
