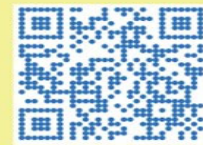

THE WORD OF GOD IS FRUITFUL

The Word of God is like a seed that God plants in the heart of man and bears fruit in the measure that it is received. The grace of salvation is offered to everyone but it is also always conditioned by the each person's free response. Some hear it, and others don't; some make it the center of their lives, while others go their way indifferently.

Sisters and Brothers:

1. Why is it that so many of our good deeds remain sterile and fruitless? It is because they are empty of the Word of God. Our consumerist, hedonistic civilization has hardened man's heart so much that he is no longer able to understand why and how Christ would cure his heart! What are the obstacles that prevent the growing of grace within my soul? Does each day's "traffic" keep me from thinking about the ultimate meaning of my life? Is it because there is no silent time where I can hear the voice of the Holy Spirit? Or is my soil full of "rocks and thorns" because of my inconstancy in good intentions and my attachment to the things of this world?

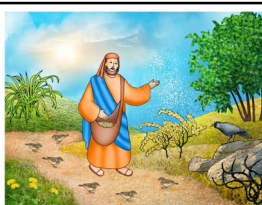
2. In a world that is run by criteria of efficiency and power, it is easy for me to fall into the temptation of thinking my worth is based on the appearance I give to others or their apparent acceptance of me. When this happens I begin to do things just to keep my reputation or to get to a higher position; I work in order to stay ahead of everyone else; I live more concerned with having than with being; I think I can achieve anything I want without the help of others, and I fall into a pride filled self-sufficiency.

Yes, I need to recognize my talents, but I must always see them as gifts from God and a call to be responsible. Here's a thought that should strengthen my commitment to those around me: "I am responsible for the world that surrounds me. No one can replace me in my task of orienting my life according to God's will." And so I am consoled by Christ's promise: "Without me you can do nothing."

3. The most generous almsgiving would be worthless, as would the most beautiful discourses and the most spectacular initiatives, if they are not born from a heart that is truly in love with God. God has sowed his grace in our hearts on the day of our baptism. It grows with our reception of the sacraments and our practice of the virtues; it is made fruitful by our good works and by the testimony of our Christian life.

It is up to us whether or not God's grace will bear fruit, and this is a comforting and motivating thought. The sower told no one "from you I expect thirty, from you seventy..." Rather, he reminds each one of us: "The first commandment applies to everyone" and he tells all of us to "be perfect as your heavenly father is perfect. Can we not say with St. Augustine, "If this saint and this other saint have reached holiness, why can't I?" Let's ask for this grace today. Amen.

LA PALABRA DE DIOS ES FECUNDA

La Palabra de Dios es como una semilla que Dios deposita en el corazón del hombre y que da fruto en la medida en que es acogida. La gracia de la salvación se ofrece a todos pero siempre va a quedar condicionada por la respuesta personal. Unos la escuchan y otros no; unos la hacen el centro de su vida, otros siguen indiferentes.

Hermanas y hermanos:

1. ¿Queremos saber por qué son estériles muchas veces nuestras acciones buenas? Porque están vacías de la Palabra de Dios. Nuestra civilización consumista y hedonista ha endurecido el corazón del hombre hasta el punto de que ya no es capaz de entender con el corazón para que Cristo lo cure. ¿Cuáles son los obstáculos que estorban el crecimiento de la gracia en mi alma? ¿Es "el tráfico del camino" lo que me impide pensar en el sentido de la vida? ¿Es la ausencia de silencio para poder escuchar la voz del Espíritu Santo? ¿O es "el terreno pedregoso y lleno de espinas" de mi inconstancia en los buenos propósitos y el apego a las cosas terrenas?

2. En un mundo que se mueve por criterios de eficacia y de poder, puedo caer en la tentación de valorarme según la apariencia que ofrezco de mí mismo o según la aceptación que creo que los demás tienen de mí. Si esto ocurre entonces hago las cosas para quedar bien o para conquistar un puesto; trabajo buscando cómo hacer para quedar siempre por encima de los demás; vivo más para tener que para ser; creo que puedo lograr cualquier meta sin la ayuda de los demás y caigo en una autosuficiencia llena de orgullo.

Es verdad que debo reconocer mis talentos, pero valorándolos como un regalo de Dios que me llevan a ser responsable. Hay un pensamiento que debe fortalecer mi compromiso hacia los demás: Yo soy responsable del mundo que me rodea. Nadie puede sustituirme en la tarea de orientar mi vida en la dirección de la voluntad de Dios. Claro que me consuela la promesa de Cristo: "Sin mí nada podéis hacer".

3. De nada valen las limosnas generosas y los bonitos discursos y las iniciativas espectaculares, si no nacen de un corazón enamorado sinceramente de Dios. La gracia que Dios ha sembrado en nuestros corazones el día de nuestro bautismo y que se incrementa con la recepción de los sacramentos y la práctica de las virtudes, fructifica a través de nuestras buenas obras y del testimonio de nuestra vida cristiana.

Saber que está en nuestras manos la medida en que va a fructificar la gracia es algo reconfortante y estimulante. A nadie le ha dicho el sembrador: "de ti espero treinta o sesenta". Más bien nos ha recordado: "El primer mandamiento vale para todos" y a todos nos dice "sed perfectos como es perfecto vuestro Padre celestial". ¿Acaso no podríamos decir con San Agustín: "Si este santo y este otro han alcanzado la meta de la santidad, ¿por qué yo no voy a poder?". Pidamos hoy al Señor que así sea.

The Curator's Corner:

By the 1780s, the population of Christianized (Baptized) Indians at Mission Dolores had swelled to over 1,100, and with farming and cattle-raising, Mission San Francisco de Asis was now well enough established to begin replacing the palizadas of the quadrangle with more permanent structures of adobe and kiln-fired tile. On April 15, 1782, the Franciscans laid the first foundation stone for the future adobe church at San Francisco. And, on April 08, 1791, the remains of Lieutenant Jose Joaquin Moraga, who had been buried before the altar of the second church, were removed for burial under the floor of the new adobe church (that is, the present church, also known as the third church).

Throughout the construction, scores of Indians worked at making the adobe bricks and the roof tiles and floor tiles, a process which took three years (1788-1791). In the mountains to the south, Native lumberers and Presidio soldiers felled sturdy redwoods, which were then dragged by oxen to the nearest creek and floated down to the bay and then to the inlet below the Mission; note the redwood beams in the ceiling of the mission church. As at all the California missions, the church was the sole object of beauty and permanence.

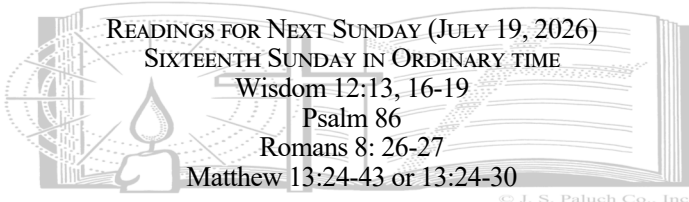
