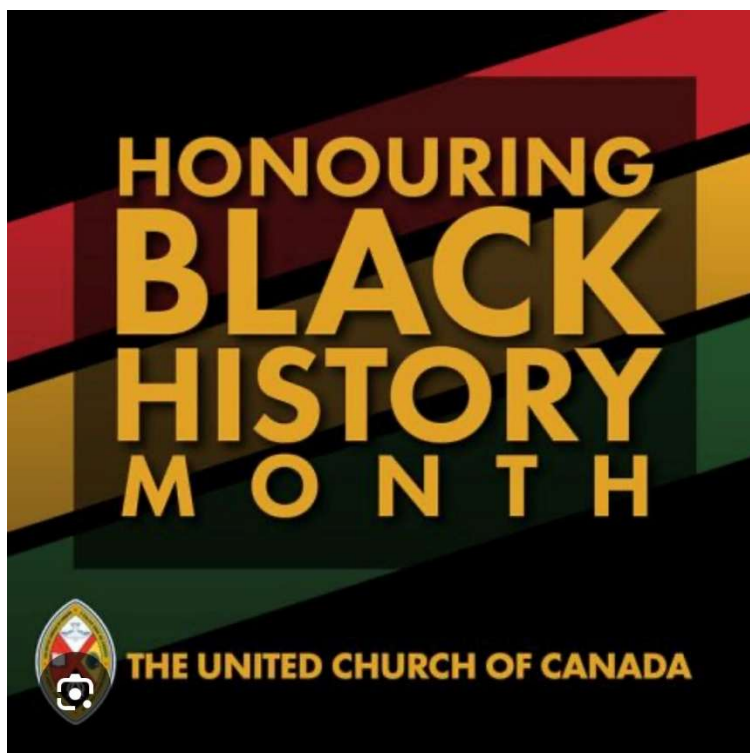

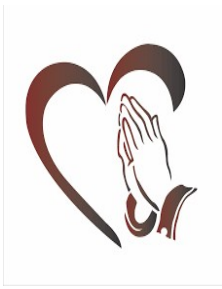
Please join us for coffee and fellowship in the CE hall (downstairs) following the Worship service this morning.

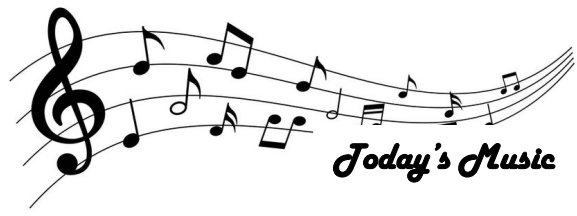
