Pool Information	Indoor, eight lane, 25 yard pool. Pool Depth is 11'6" - 12'6" at the start end and 4' at the bulkhead (turn end). Ample parking and spectator seating is available. Concessions will be available on Saturday. No food or beverage is allowed on the pool deck or in spectator areas. Bottled water allowed. <i>The Meet host will ensure the required course dimensions.</i>

Timing	All events will be timed using Colorado timing system with horn start, touch pads, button, and two watches as backup. For 25y events: Swimmers will start at the blocks and finish at the bulkhead (timing by button with two watches as backup). The Meet Director reserves the right to reverse the starting and finishing ends pending any timing equipment issues. Any changes will be immediately communicated to participants and coaches.
Rules	This meet is sanctioned by USA Swimming and Wisconsin Swimming, Inc. All USA Swimming and WSI rules apply including safety rules, which will be strictly enforced. All athletes must be registered USA Swimming members. Age is as of June 26, 2026. Out of state entrants must bring a valid USA Swimming card and present it to the Meet Director prior to swimming. Any swimmer entered in the meet must be certified by a USA Swimming member coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water. When unaccompanied by a member-coach, it is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement. All adults participating in or associated with this meet acknowledge that they are subject to the provisions of the USA Swimming Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy ("MAAPP"), and that they understand that compliance with MAAPP is a condition of

	<p>participation in the conduct of this competition. Times achieved by an athlete member at a sanctioned/approved meet who is over 18 years of age who had not completed the Athlete Protection Training (or whose APT training had expired) by the date of the swim, will not be able to be uploaded to SWIMS. This includes participation as a member of a relay. These athletes will also be considered “not in good standing” and can be subject to fines under Wisconsin Swimming Policy 11.2.1.</p>
SAFE SPORT 360	<p>The USA Swimming Safe Sport program is USA Swimming’s comprehensive abuse prevention program dedicated to creating a healthy and positive environment free from abuse for all its members. Components of the program include, but are not limited to, providing education and training, enforcing policies (such as the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy), rules and best practice guidelines, promoting healthy boundaries and mandatory reporting of violations.</p> <p>The Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy prohibits Adult Participants (as defined) from having one-on-one interactions with minor athletes which are not within an observable and interruptible distance from another adult. Adult Participants are required to abide by this policy in full during this meet.</p> <p>Pursuant to USA Swimming Rules and Regulations and federal law, it is every member’s responsibility to immediately (i.e., within 24 hours) report any incident of child abuse, including physical or sexual abuse, to law enforcement and the U.S. Center for SafeSport. Reporting must occur when an individual has firsthand knowledge of misconduct or where specific and credible information has been received from a victim or knowledgeable third party. Various state laws may also require reporting to law enforcement or to a designated child protection agency.</p> <p>For information on how to report other alleged violations, including without limitation, the USA Swimming Code of Conduct and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy, please visit www.usaswimming.org/report.</p> <p>All athletes age 18 and older must complete Athlete Protection Training in order to be a USA Swimming registered member in good standing. Any athlete who turns 18 on or after May 28, 2026, who has not completed Athlete Protection Training by the first day of competition, will be prohibited from participating in the competition until such time as all membership requirements are completed. Times achieved by an athlete who turns age 18 on or after May 28, 2026, who competes in this USA Swimming sanctioned event without completing this membership requirement, will NOT count for qualification or recognition. This includes participation as a member of a relay.</p>
Coaches	<p>All coaches, acting in a coaching capacity, must display the current membership card at all times while on deck. <u>All coaches will need to check-in and show credentials at the Scoring Table at the start of each session.</u> Coaches’ Packets will be available at time of check-in.</p>

Warm-ups	<p>Meet Director will determine warm-up schedule and lane assignments to be communicated by Wednesday, June 24, 2026.</p> <p>Feet first three-point entries from the starting end of the pool during general warm-ups will be enforced for all sanctioned/approved competition.</p> <p>Swimmer(s) without a coach present are to report to the Meet Director prior to warm-ups for lane assignment.</p>
Meet Entry	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Entries will be accepted starting <u>at noon</u> on June 8, 2026 through June 15, 2026 or until full. ● Changes and time updates allowed through June 22, 2026. ● No reservations will be taken for the meet. Entries will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis. ● If/when the meet fills, all further entries will be denied. ● Entries not accepted will be notified by email as soon as possible. <p>Entries must be submitted by email in HY-TEK entry file to the Meet Director. Email HY-TEK file to Brent Siler at: mssmeetdirector@gmail.com</p> <p>Completed entry form, signed waiver, and fees must be received by the meet host prior to the start of the meet or given to the Meet Director at check in prior to the start of the meet.</p>
Deck Entries	<p>Deck entries will be at the Meet Director's discretion, will only be allowed up until 30 minutes prior to the start of the session AND only if there are open lanes available (new heats will not be added). Deck entries must be able to prove their USA Swimming membership. No on-site USA Swimming registrations will be accepted.</p> <p>Deck entry is \$10 per individual event (plus entry fees if athlete is not already registered in the meet) and \$20 per relay event (plus entry fees if athletes are not already registered in the meet).</p>
Special Needs	<p>A Para Accommodation/Modification form must be utilized for any requests that need to be presented to the meet referee. This form should be completed and presented prior to the start of the meet.</p> <p>Link to Form</p>
Entry Limits	<p>Athletes are limited to two (2) entries on Friday and four (4) individual events and one (1) relay event on Saturday, with a maximum of six (6) individual events and one (1) relay event for the meet.</p> <p>Entries will be accepted in the order they are received.</p>

Heat Sheets	Shared electronically prior to the meet. Limited printed copies will be available at the meet.
Events	All events are timed finals and are pre-seeded. Fly over starts will be used. For 25y events, swimmers will start at the blocks and finish at the bulkhead end of the pool (see Timing section above). Swimmers will exit out the side of the pool. Friday distance events are Open events, will be seeded fastest to slowest, and scored by age group (10 &U, 11-12, 13-14, Senior). Positive check-in will be conducted and end no later than 30 minutes before the session start. NOTE: Athletes will need to provide their own <u>counters</u> for Friday events (timers and lap counting boards furnished by MSS).
Admission	Admission is included in each athlete's entry fees. Families with 3 or more swimmers: contact the Meet Director prior to June 22 nd for reduced fees. Seating available in the mezzanine for seniors and those needing special accommodation. Elevator available. Accessible drop-off available outside pool entrance on south side of school.
Concessions	Concessions (Saturday only) and hospitality for coaches & officials provided (all sessions). No food or drinks to be brought into the pool or spectator mezzanine. Water only!
Awards	Individual events - 1st thru 16th place ribbons by age group Distance events – 1 st thru 16 th place by age group (10&U, 11-12, 13-14, Senior) Relay events - 1st thru 3rd place ribbons Heat Winner awards provided for all events <i>Awards not claimed will be bagged and given to each clubs' coaches at the end of the meet.</i>
Final Results	An electronic copy of all meet results will be sent to participating teams via email post-meet. Unofficial results can also be found on MeetMobile.
First Aid	Report injuries to the Lifeguard and Meet Director. First aid kit is located at the entrance of the pool office, behind the Timers Table. AED is available outside the pool entrance near the building entrance.
Conduct	It is the swimmer's responsibility to be at the blocks or the bulkhead at the start of their event. Staging for 8&U individual events will be provided behind the blocks, and coaches are encouraged to ensure their swimmers are ready. No food allowed on-deck; water only. A hospitality room is available off-deck for coaches and officials. The shallow section of the pool is for cool-down only. No horseplay/loitering. Swimmers and swimmers' bags are not allowed in the mezzanine/spectator seating. Please meet your swimmer in the hallway.

	<p>No flash photography during the starts.</p> <p>All coaches are responsible for the conduct of their swimmers and will see that their club has proper supervision at all times. Meet Marshals have the authority to remove any swimmer and/or spectator from the meet for any violation such as improper behavior, damage to property, etc. No smoking on the premises. Please encourage your parents and swimmers to clean up after themselves.</p> <p>Use of audio or visual recording devices, including cell phones, is not permitted in the changing areas, restrooms, or locker rooms.</p> <p>Changing into or out of swimsuits other than in locker rooms or other designated areas is not appropriate and is prohibited. Deck changes are prohibited.</p> <p>Operation of a drone, or any other flying apparatus, is prohibited over the venue (pools, athlete/coach areas, spectator areas and open ceiling locker rooms) any time athletes, coaches, officials and/or spectators are present.</p>
Image Authorization	<p>All participants agree to be filmed and photographed by the official photographer(s) and network(s) of Wisconsin Swimming and the meet host under the conditions authored by Wisconsin and USA Swimming, and allow event organizers the right to use names, pictures, likenesses, and biographical information before, during or after the period of participation in this Wisconsin Swimming competition to promote such competitions.</p>
