DAY I: Monday, 2-19: "Discipline"

Discipline is needed for correction. We need to be honest with ourselves and be willing to accept correction. Pray that we will be willing to learn and grow through discipline.

"Hold on to instruction; don't let go. Guard it, for it is your life."
(Proverbs 4:13)

DAY 2: Tuesday, 2-20: "Dedication"

Dedication takes commitment. We must constantly remind ourselves who is the One who holds our future. Pray that God will lead us to be dedicated to the things of God.

"you yourselves, as living stones, a spiritual house, are being built to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." (1 Peter 2:5)

DAY 3: Wednesday, 2-21: "Holiness"

Our lives should reflect the holiness of God. This takes discipline and dedication to the things of God. Pray for God to help us all to be holy to honor Him.

"As obedient children, do not be conformed to the desires of your former ignorance. But as the one who called you is holy, you also are to be holy in all your conduct; for it is written, be holy, because I am holy." (I Peter I:14-16).

DAY 4: Thursday, 2-22: "Sanctification"

Becoming more like Christ is the life journey for all believers. Pray that each moment, circumstance, and relationship makes you more like Jesus. "to be a minister of Christ Jesus to the Gentiles, serving as a priest of the gospel of God. God's purpose is that the Gentiles may be an acceptable offering, sanctified by the Holy Spirit." (Romans 15:16)

DAY 5: Friday, 2-23: "Wisdom"

Pray that the wisdom of God trumps our own and that He will give you the wisdom to face your current situations and the things ahead.

"Wisdom and strength belong to God; counsel and understanding are his." (Job 12:13)

DAY 6 Saturday, 2-24: "Fruits of the Spirit"

May our lives be a display of his love, mercy, grace and be evident by the fruit of our lives. Pray that this is true in our lives.

"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. The law is not against such things." (Galatians 5:22-23)

DAY 7: Sunday, 2-25: "Joy"

Joy is not an emotion, it is finding contentment in any and all circumstance and counting each day a blessing. Pray that God will allow this truth to renew you today.

"Consider it a great joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you experience various trials, because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance." (James 1:2-3)

DAY 8: Monday, 2-26: "Perseverance"

The Christian walk is difficult and causes us to be weary. Take heart the God who never grows weary is carrying you through it. Pray that God helps us to persevere through it all.

"Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the Lord's work, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain." (1 Corinthians 15:58)

DAY 9: Tuesday, 2-27: "Spiritual Warfare"

Warfare is something real that followers of Jesus face. The great news is we have victory through Jesus! You can declare that victory today! "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms." (Ephesians 6:12)

DAY 10: Wednesday, 2-28: "Sin Struggles"

Sin is something that we all face everyday, but sin does not have to rule over us. We can overcome because He provides our strength.

"In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus. Therefore, do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires." (Romans 6:11-12)

DAY II: Thursday, 2-29: "Habits"

Habits are the things that we do on a regular basis, many times without even thinking about them. Pray that your habits reflect the nature and character of Jesus.

"Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things." (Philippians 4:8)

DAY 12: Friday, 3-1: "Temptation"

Jesus faced temptation by Satan and overcame every temptation by quoting scripture. We too can overcome the temptations that we face. "No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can endure it." (1 Corinthians 10:13)

DAY 13: Saturday, 3-2: "Love"

Love was demonstrated greatest to us by what Jesus did for us. Because Jesus loves us, we too can love others.

"The commandments, 'You shall not commit adultery,' 'You shall not murder,' 'You shall not steal,' 'You shall not covet,' and whatever other command there may be, are summed up in this one command: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' Love does no harm to a neighbor. Therefore love is the fulfillment of the law." (Romans 13:9-10)

DAY 14: Sunday, 3-3: "Grief"

Life is not easy at times. Grief is something that cannot be ignored.

Through the power of Jesus, we can go through grief victorious.

"For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:38-39)

DAY 15: Monday, 3-4: "Pain"

Pain reaches every single one of us. And in the pain that we face, God is there with us every step of the way.

"Dear friends, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that has come on you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice inasmuch as you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when his glory is revealed."

1 Peter 4:12-13

DAY 16: Tuesday, 3-5: "Suffering"

None of us like it, but the Bible tells us that we will face suffering. Why? So that we can identify with what Jesus did for us. And it is through suffering that God is able to form us and make us into the image of Jesus.

"For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe in him, but also to suffer for him..." Philippians 1:29

DAY 17: Wednesday, 3-6: "Forgiveness"

Forgiveness is letting go - it is releasing the other person from the wrong they have done to you. God demonstrated this to us through the finished work of Jesus.

"Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.' And they divided up his clothes by casting lots." (Luke 23:34)

DAY 18: Thursday, 3-7: "Faith"

Faith is the complete trust in, confidence in, and reliance on God. It is the opposite of doubt. Pray that God strengthens your faith.

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own understanding; in all your ways know him, and he will make your paths straight." (Proverbs 3:5-6)

DAY 19: Friday, 3-8: "Faithfulness"

Faithfulness comes from a place of trust in and loyalty to God and requires us to submit our ways to God. Pray that your life reflects the faithfulness of God.

"Let us hold on to the confession of our hope without wavering, since he who promised is faithful." (Hebrews 10:23)

DAY 20: Saturday, 3-9: "Obedience"

Obedience is when we completely surrender to His authority and base our decisions and our actions on His Word. Pray that you will be obedient in your life.

"And when he had come as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death even to death on a cross. For this reason God highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Philippians 2:8-11)

DAY 21: Sunday, 3-10: "Tithing"

Tithing is a practice of consistently following the example of Christ, who gave even his life. We should cheerfully give to advance his kingdom. Pray that God will give you a heart to give.

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

(Matthew 6:21)

DAY 22: Monday, 3-11: "Finances"

Finances dominate our thoughts and actions, but we know it belongs to God. Be wise and do not be consumed with financial stress. Pray that God gives you contentment in what He has provided for you.

"A generous person will be blessed, for he shares his food with the poor." (Proverbs 22:9)

DAY 23: Tuesday, 3-12: "Prosperity"

Prosperity does not necessarily mean that everything is going well, but simply means that you are in the center of God's Will; pray that God will allow you to prosper.

"The one who pursues righteousness and faithful love will find life, righteousness, and honor." (Proverbs 21:21)

DAY 24: Wednesday, 3-13: "Community"

God has called us to live a life together, to encourage one another, to build each other up and to work together to do the Will of God. Pray that God will help us to have true and meaningful community.

"Now all the believers were together and held all things in common." (Acts 2:44)

DAY 25: Thursday, 3-14: "Relationship Building"

Look for those in your life who God is calling you to build a relationship with, or to reestablish a past one. They should know you serve the Lord by how you treat them. This takes dedication and prayer.

"By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:35)

DAY 26: Friday, 3-15: "Conflict Resolution"

When humans interact in a fallen world, conflict will abound. Recognize this and do all you can to live at peace with one another. Pray that God will guide us through this process when necessary.

"bearing with one another and forgiving one another if anyone has a grievance against another. Just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you are also to forgive." (Colossians 3:13)

DAY 27: Saturday 3-16: "Unity"

God has called us to live together in unity. This applies to the church. Pray that God will keep us united, bringing glory to God in all we do.

"Now I urge you, brothers, and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree in what you say, that there be no divisions among you, and that you be united with the same understanding and the same conviction." (I Corinthians I:10)

DAY 28: Sunday 3-17: "Vision"

God will place on our hearts a vision to do great things because God is the God of great things. Pray that God will give us a clear vision of what He is calling us to do.

"Commit your activities to the LORD, and your plans will be established." (Proverbs 16:3)

DAY 29: Monday, 3-18: "Growth"

Growth is the process of development and maturing for the progress of the Kingdom of God and the spiritual development of believers both individually and corporately. Pray for God to grow you and grow His church.

"Like newborn infants, desire the pure milk of the word, so that by it you may grow up into your salvation, if you have tasted that the Lord is good." (I Peter 2: 2-3)

DAY 30: Tuesday, 3-19: "Ministry"

God calls us to serve those around us well. Everything we do is a ministry to others and we must remember to do it all well and for the glory of God.

"So whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God." (I Corinthians 10:31)

DAY 31: Wednesday, 3-20: "Accountability"

Biblical accountability begins with taking responsibility for one's own actions and making a conscious choice of allowing God and others to help in accomplishing what is right. Pray that we can hold one another accountable to build each other up.

"Iron sharpens iron, and one person sharpens another." (Proverbs 27:17)

"So then, each of us will give an account of himself to God."
(Romans 14:12)

DAY 32: Thursday, 3-21: "Church Staff"

Thank God for the leadership he has placed here and pray that He will help them to serve well and raise up new leaders to serve.

"Remember your leaders who have spoken God's word to you. As you carefully observe the outcome of their lives, imitate their faith." (Hebrews 13:7)

DAY 33: Friday, 3-22: "Government Leaders"

All authority comes from God. Pray for the leaders in positions of power and pray that God can use these leaders to advance His Kingdom. Remember, God is control not people.

"First of all, then, I urge that petitions, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all those who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity." (I Timothy 2:1-2)

DAY 34: Saturday, 3-23: "Missions Local and Global"

God has called us to be engaged in local and global efforts to see the Kingdom of God advanced through Jesus. Pray for these efforts and for God to reveal your personal role in this vital call.

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

DAY 35: Sunday, 3-24: "Gospel Witness"

God has done a work in each one of us. We are not to be silent about what Jesus has done for us. Pray that your words and deeds display the love of Jesus to those around you!

"In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:16)

DAY 36: Monday, 3-25: "Courage"

This world rejects the things of God. However, we must still press forward and not be silent about what God has done through His son Jesus. We must also stand firm on biblical truth even when it is counter-cultural. This requires courage!

"Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong." (1 Corinthians 16:13)

DAY 37: Tuesday, 3-26: "Boldness"

Boldness is not arrogance. Boldness is confidence. It is assurance. It is the belief that God indeed is real and will provide for you.

"Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness. Stretch out your hand to heal and perform signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus." Acts 4:29-30

DAY 38: Wednesday, 3-27: "Spiritual Power"

The Kingdom of God is a matter of power, and this power is seen greatest when we are weakest.

"But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." 2 Corinthians 12:9-10

DAY 39: Thursday, 3-28: "Peace"

Peace according to this world's standard is fragile and based upon conditions. God's peace through His son Jesus is rock solid and can be counted on.

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27)

DAY 40: Friday, 3-29: "Personal Purpose"

Each one of us has been uniquely created by God. Therefore, God, the Master Designer, has a perfect plan and purpose for our lives.

"...being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." (Philippians 1:6)
