

CURRENTLY NOT COLLECTABLE STATUS (CNC)



What Happens While Your Account is in CNC?

The IRS will discontinue all collection activity. As a result, the IRS won't levy your assets and/or income. The IRS will, however, still assess interest and penalties to your account. In addition, if you are eligible for a refund in a future filing year, the IRS will likely keep that refund to apply to your tax debt.



Why Did I Receive a Bill from the IRS?

Every year you will receive a bill from the IRS even though your account is in CNC. The IRS is simply keeping you informed of the amount you owe.



Can I Make Payments to the IRS?

Yes, you can make voluntary payments to the IRS. However, you are not required to make any payments while you're in CNC.



How Do You Place Your Account in CNC?

To put yourself into CNC status, contact the IRS at the number shown on the notice or at 1-800-829-7650. You will need to explain your financial situation to the agent, and request that your account be placed into CNC status. The IRS may require you to complete a Form 433-F, *Collection Information Statement*, concerning your financial situation.
