



CQE: Certificate of Qualification for Employment



What is a CQE?

CQE is short for Certificate of Qualification for Employment. It helps people with criminal records obtain employment. A CQE holder has gone through a rigorous review process by the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, a judge, and a probation department. The result of the process is a determination that the person is rehabilitated and ready to enter the workforce.

How does a CQE benefit employers?



- 1. A CQE allows an employer hire someone with a criminal record that previously excluded them from consideration.
- 2. A CQE provides immunity to employers for negligent hiring claims.

What does it mean when a person has a CQE?



A CQE allows an employer to individually assess whether a person is right for the job regardless of their criminal record. It makes the hiring process discretionary even if the person was previously prohibited from a certain type of employment because of a criminal conviction.
