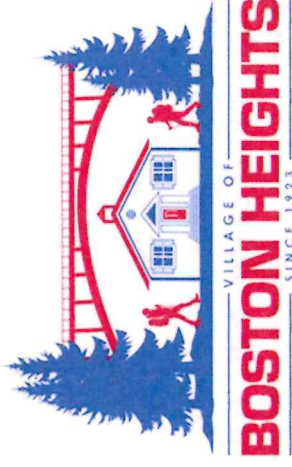

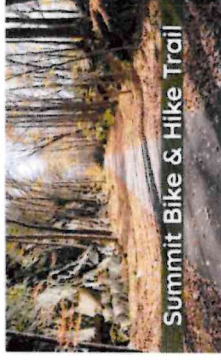

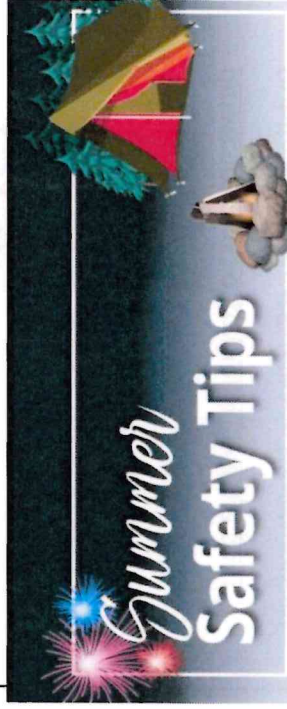

Keep these tips in mind as you and your family enjoy summer vacations, camping, family reunions, picnics and the Fourth of July.

Fire safety



Build campfires at least 25 feet away from tents, shrubs and anything that can burn.



If you want to see fireworks, go to a public show put on by experts. Sparklers can reach 1,200 F and cause third-degree burns.



Use propane, charcoal and wood pellet barbecue grills outdoors only. Indoor use can cause a fire or carbon monoxide poisoning.

Place your grill well away from siding and deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches. Do not store or use a grill on a porch or balcony.



Use chimneys, outdoor fireplaces, and fire pits outdoors only and at least 10 feet away from your home or anything that can burn.

Have a safe summer season. As always reach out to the fire department for safety tips to make your summer festivities a success.

Our eight pickleball courts are seeing tremendous use, proving that pickleball is equal parts exercise, competition, and neighborhood social hour. It's great seeing residents of all ages out enjoying the courts, walking trails, pavilion, and park amenities together. The park has truly become a centerpiece of our community.

We are also excited about a meaningful new addition coming soon to the park. Eight decorative four-sided posts will soon be installed with brackets for memorial wind chimes, creating space for 32 memorial chimes throughout the park. Memorial wind chimes are personalized chimes placed in honor or memory of loved ones, offering families a peaceful and lasting tribute that can be enjoyed by visitors for years to come. On a quiet summer evening, the gentle sound of the chimes across the pond and walking paths should add both

beauty and reflection to an already special place in our Village.

The Village is also in the final stages of transferring the former Norwood Inn property to the new development ownership group. This long-awaited redevelopment project is an important investment in the future of Boston Heights, and groundbreaking is currently expected by mid-September.
