MAYOR'S REPORT:

The Norwood Inn is completely down; all that remains is the surrounding fence.

The Mayor stated that during the Mayor and Council term, every member must take the Ohio Sunshine Law training; two Council members are still uncompleted, and he urged them to take this training now. There is also a survey for fraud risk assessment for each Council member that must be taken; there are 2 members who still must complete this. The survey has been available for over 9 months, and the Village was cited because this survey has not been completed by one member, and another member checked they suspect there is fraud, but did not provide any explanation as to why they checked this on the survey. Mayor Antal stressed that checking this box on possible fraud is a big deal, and if anyone suspects this at any time, they should come to him. By checking this box, they have held up the process. The risk assessment team has tried to contact the Council member numerous times on this matter, with no response. The Mayor stated these 2 surveys must be completed and the fraud accusation explained immediately. If the Council member suspects fraud, show them some proof, or retract the statement on the survey. He stated that if this is not completed by the next meeting, these Council members' names will be revealed. Mayor Antal also informed the Council that the Governor has vetoed the property tax items. On July 21st, there is an override session that will be conducted.

Richard Herbig wanted to honor Neil Kacmarcik because he is turning 80 years old this week by wishing him a Happy Birthday.

Dr. Laura Miller asked about the state of getting public water for those residents who currently have wells. She has talked to multiple well-drilling companies, who do not recommend redrilling due to the high cost and no guarantee of hitting water, she lives on Brandywine Rd. The Mayor explained the Village is divided into 5 quadrants to get water to. The Village does surveys to see if these quadrants want water in their area. This survey was completed last year, and unfortunately, less-populated roads are not as high on the list because of the expense to run it there. This is not the Village's choice; it is the water company's choice. The Mayor stated they would be able to contact Summit County to see if there is anything they can do. The Mayor also said he would check and see, in the case of undrinkable water from these wells, if there is anything else that can be done.
