It is with sadness that we share the news that


Marilyn Elliot passed away on Tuesday, December 6th.

This year we **budgeted for a deficit** of **\$26,471** and we find ourselves quite behind at this time..

As of November 30, our actual income is \$213,000 while spending on church programmes, salaries and property maintenance totals \$256,000.

This leaves us with a deficit of \$43,000 at this time.
