We have changed the date of our <u>First Annual Meeting</u> from March 3 to April 7. Much effort and spirit go in to preparing for this day. Thanks for your patience.



COMMUNITY DINNER PROGRAM OPPORTUNITIES



Our good friend Valeria generously plans, shops for and prepares the dinner every other month. The Caring Kitchen Team looks for others to fill that role in the months between. In March we were delighted to welcome the 6th Dundas Scouts, their leaders and parents, who hosted a delicious home cooked meal for our guests. In May, Brigitte Clarke will be key person and she has already lined up a team of helpers.

Memorabilia Items

As we travel the path to becoming one worshipping Community of Faith, we have experienced hiccups, twists and turns, unexpected bumps but also gained some amazing new friends and fresh ideas and enthusiasm and hope for our future together!

One of the areas that our Council asked us to consider were the items from Knox and Binkley that were important and meaningful to each church. Representatives from Binkley, Knox, Rock Chapel and St. Mark's met to discuss the items they wished to bring to Highland Hills. This Ad Hoc Memorabilia Team met several times and came up with a list of items which were presented to Council. Many of the items on this list fell under the Worship Team, specifically the Sanctuary. Council asked that the Worship Team to look over the suggestion list and come up with some recommendations.

The Worship Team determined that Knox and Binkley should have some item in the Sanctuary that was important to them. Both Binkley and Knox have given up their church building and experienced all the emotions that go along with that. St Mark's has been fortunate to open their doors to Binkley and Knox but has not experienced

the same sense of loss. With these thoughts in mind, the Worship Team made the following recommendations:

- The Binkley Communion Table (now located in the Narthex) be placed at the front of the Sanctuary and the St. Mark's Communion Table be placed in the Narthex.
- · Binkley Plant Stands continue to be put into seasonal use.
- The Knox Baptismal Font be placed at the entrance to the Sanctuary and be used for all baptisms. The St. Mark's Baptismal Font would be retired.
- The Knox Memorial stand, photos of past ministers from all three churches, the wall mounted carved Lord's Prayer from Binkley be displayed in a history corner at Highland Hills (location to be determined).
- · Pictures of each building (Binkley, Knox, Rock Chapel and St. Mark's) be displayed in the lower foyer at the bottom of the stairs.
- The corner stone(s) of Binkley will be part of the new building on the Binkley site, as outlined in their contract.

The Worship Team reported back to the Council with these recommendations. At our March Council meeting we reviewed the recommendations and Council approved them.

This outlines how the process unfolded. Some decisions are easy while others require thoughtful consideration. The Worship Team and the Council considered what it means to be one Community of Faith, the give and take involved and the compromise that is required. We hope that by providing you with this information, you will have a solid understanding of how these decisions were made. Should you have any questions or concerns, feel free to speak with Rev. Highland Hills Dream, Path and Promise 2024

Over the fall and winter months, our congregation had the opportunity to meet with Chris Wignall to explore our vision for our future together as Highland Hills Faith Community. This gave us a chance to share our ideas, listen and learn from each other.

The Council has received a report from Chris Wignall summarizing our thoughts. The Council referred this report to an Ad Hoc Committee (Rev. Ian, Rev. Peg, Dorothy Bartalos and Fran Elliot) who met to review the wording of the Dream, Path and Promise.

After considerable discussion, the committee decided to reframe the format in a Trinitarian fashion (Dream – God; Path – Son; Promise – Spirit). The Ad Hoc Committee presented the re-drafted Dream, Path and Promise to the Council. Council approved the draft for presentation and approval at the AGM on April 7.

The following is the wording to be presented:

Our Dream: To welcome all people to build God's Kingdom by sharing the Good News of God's love for one another and the wider community.

Our Path: To follow the way of Jesus as we seek to meet the current issues and spiritual needs facing our society.

Our Promise: To be open to the leading of the Holy Spirit in all our ministry.

Naming Our Church


Last Spring, the Council approved a temporary name, Highland Hills Faith Community, for our joint congregations. At our February Council meeting, the Ad Hoc Committee was also asked to make a recommendation for a permanent name.

During our Visioning sessions, it became apparent that how we express our denominational affiliation and whether we identify as a church, were two concerning issues. It was also clear that there was general acceptance of the name Highland Hills.

To address these concerns, the Ad Hoc Committee has recommended to the Council that the official name be:

Highland Hills Faith Community An Ecumenical Ministry of the United and Presbyterian Churches

This name would appear on all church correspondence as our official name. Council approved this recommendation and will present it at the AGM on April 7 for approval.






MISSION & SERVICE STORIES Preserving Culture through Language Revitalization
