## **Pastor's Perspective - Holy Anxiety**

"Then [Jesus] got into the boat and his disciples followed him. Suddenly a furious storm came up on the lake, so that the waves swept over the boat. But Jesus was sleeping. The disciples went and woke him, saying, "Lord, save us! We're going to drown!" [Jesus] replied, "You of little faith, why are you so afraid?" Then he got up and rebuked the winds and the waves, and it was completely calm."

—Matthew 8:23-26

In this gospel story, we hear a familiar refrain: 'Why are you so afraid?' This seems a ridiculous question. On the one hand, this was just another day in these fishermen's lives. Jesus and the disciples are in a boat on the sea. This happened all the time. Jesus fell asleep. That probably also happened all the time. What was different this time, though, was while Jesus was sleeping, a huge storm blew up and threatened to swamp the boat. The disciples were fishermen. They knew this storm could cause them all to drown. The disciples certainly knew their way around sailing. They also knew when conditions were outside of their control. Their anxiety about their lack of control caused them to wake Jesus – albeit unkindly – so that he could fix this problem. In that moment of anxiety, they turned to the one they knew could *do something*. This is when Jesus asks them 'Why are you so afraid,' questioning them *before* he calmed the storm. But then, Jesus calmed the storm.

Anxiety is a natural response to life's stressors. Whenever something changes, our bodies and brains naturally respond with heightened anxiety. As with so many things, anxiety can be either a tool or a hindrance. As a tool, anxiety pushes us toward Jesus and forward into service to the world. This holy anxiety creates excitement and hope for new things. As a hindrance, anxiety causes us to turn in on ourselves and lash out toward others. It pushes away those who are in the boat with us, destabilizing the boat and risking everything. In this story, Jesus' disciples do both. When the disciples discover that conditions are suddenly uncomfortably outside of their control, they look to Jesus to guide them. When they find him asleep, though, they wake him rudely and angrily. They lash out in their fear. What might have happened if Jesus got angry and lashed back

at them? We may not have had anyone to tell this story! Instead, Jesus responds with grace – both to remind them of their faith, and to keep them safe.

Whenever things feel unstable, we naturally respond with anxiety. When the waves pick up and the boat begins to be swamped, we get scared. We might react by focusing on what we can control – like bailing water out of the boat. We might react with irritability or anger – like screaming at Jesus. We might react with faith and grace – as Jesus invites his disciples to do. Uncertainty and change naturally increase anxiety. We cannot change or prevent that. However, we can choose – how will we meet these storms? Do we choose to meet the storms with faith or fear?

Of course, we all know that sometimes we will react to the storms of life with fear. There will be moments when discontent leads to argument instead of collaboration. There will be times that emotions come out sideways and someone gets hurt. Sometimes, instead of gently shaking Jesus awake and asking for help, we will roughly shove and shout at him (or each other). All of this happens to us – just as it did to the disciples. When this happens, though, we have the opportunity to respond with grace as Jesus does, asking with compassion 'Why are you so afraid?' and then working toward a solution. In these moments, Jesus invites us into humility and faith, giving us the grace to apologize, to forgive each other and ourselves.

Choosing faith in the midst of uncertainty requires intention and community. As a Christian community, we know that we need each other and we experience God's grace when we gather with each other. We especially need each other when the waves threaten to overtake us. In these times, Jesus invites us into a closer relationship with Jesus and with each other, so we might respond to our community with faith and grace. With faith, the storms that raise our anxiety become an opportunity to grow together in faith and deepen our commitment to Love God. Follow Jesus, Invite All.

Also, in continuing our support of **Viator House of Hospitality** as a Faith Community Partner, we will be collecting new winter coats-- for the young men who have worn out or outgrown their old coats, who arrived after this past winter, or will be arriving this fall/winter.

At the time of this writing, we do not know yet how many coats are needed and in what sizes. Please watch for announcements in Wednesday emails about the specific needs. Solid-color puffer style coats are preferred. Please put a note attached to the tag that it is for VHH.

All coats/snowsuits need to be new, heavy-weight, water repellent, hooded, and machine washable.

If you prefer, you may make a donation to Prince of Peace, notated that it is for purchasing coats. You may specify if it is for LSSI or VHH; unspecified donations will be used where needed most.

There will be a collection bin for coats in the Fellowship Hall on Sunday mornings. If you are coming in during the week, please drop them off in the office. The collection will start on Sunday October 19th and will end on Sunday November 2nd.

Please help the youth celebrate this holiday safely!


#### Baked Goods Needed for the All Saints' Eve Cake Walk

It's hard to be patient when I still take forever getting dressed or see the school bus go by with me not at a school to greet them. I do one load of laundry and feel like I have run the Boston marathon and am ready for a nap. I haven't seen the grandsons in one sporting event all summer. You did know I was a grandma, didn't you? They said they understand but my grandma's heart just aches. I want to be better! How long will this post stroke last? I have heard that you are more emotional following a stroke. They got that one right!

What about you? Are you suffering from a chronic disease that makes you continually ache all over? Have you lost your job and don't know what to do with the time on your hands? Is your house just plain too quiet without a spouse or an older child? Is the highlight of the day a trip to the oncologist or neurologist? Are you getting bills from doctors whose names you can't pronounce, and you don't remember seeing? Is your pile of bills so high it is falling off your table? Do you cry when you see diaper commercials on TV?

You know my spiel from here. It's healthy to have someone to talk with. Stephen Ministry can provide just that. You will get an individual assigned to just you. Then you two decide when and where to meet. It's all free from there and guaranteed confidential. It's hard to get better than that. You gather weekly from then on for about an hour. You can meet for a month, a year or whatever best meets your needs.


At the annual meeting and following, the Church Council has presented a realistic look at our current and future budgets and has already started to bring in additional money with community events like renting out space to the park district for fitness classes and other community organizations, our entertainment events and bingo. I know that it is tempting to focus on finding ways to meet our income needs to keep the staff paid and the building functional so we still have our familiar worship available and can keep the doors open.

We need to stay focused on our mission to share the most precious gift with those around us; and that is the gift of salvation given to us by Jesus; who took responsibility for all our sins. It is a curious gift to share because the more we share it the more we get from it. It only grows from being given away not diminished.

It turns out the community events we do provide great outreach to the community. A few of the participants in the exercise class joined Prince of Peace. Every time we have an entertainment event I try to sit with visitors so I can talk about our church. The pre-school gives us constant contact with young families. Even with our parking, Mark Walther gets to talk to the students and some of the parents about our faith community. Maybe our need to make money off hosting community events on our property is a backdoor way for God to push us to interact with our community to talk about the message of salvation.

The bottom line is that there are only three ways to bring our budget into balance; cut expenses, bring in more donations and bring in more income from events. The best way to increase our donations isn't to scare or guilt our current members into giving more, it is to invite new members into our community. Money aside, by doing so we will be fulfilling what I see as a prime purpose of Christians – making new Christians by sharing the message of salvation. If we don't do this, there won't be much point to raising enough money to keep the doors open because in another 25 years, there won't be many left to come through the doors.

Born to survivalists in the mountains of Idaho, Tara Westover was seventeen the first time she set foot in a classroom. Her family was so isolated from mainstream society that there was no one to ensure the children received an education, and no one to intervene when one of Tara's older brothers became violent. When another brother got himself into college, Tara decided to try a new kind of life. Her quest for knowledge transformed her, taking her over oceans and across continents, to Harvard and to Cambridge University. Only then would she wonder if she'd traveled too far, if there was still a way home. "Beautiful and propulsive . . . Despite the singularity of Westover's childhood, the questions her book poses are universal: How much of ourselves should we give to those we love? And how much must we betray them to grow up?"
