

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

It is truly a privilege to serve as Chair of the Pastoral Council here at St. John Parish. I am so proud to be a member of this vibrant community!

I also have the great pleasure of being invited by Fr. Parrish to take part in the recently formed Parish Family Leadership Council. Over the summer, this consultative body, composed of staff and parishioners from all three churches, began reviewing the first phase of the One Parish Planning process, "Who are we?" which is focused on understanding the history, gifts, communities and ministries of each parish in a parish family. This first phase includes parishioner listening sessions, which are being planned right now - and possibly underway by the time this letter is published. Everyone is encouraged to participate and share their insights as part of the One Parish Planning process.

If you subscribe to the Archdiocese Partners in the Gospel newsletter, you may have recently seen that attendance across the diocese is up about 10%! This is so encouraging but not surprising. #### **FAITH FORMATION COMMISSION**



# Finance Council

### Frank Feeman, Chair

Please note that St. John reports financial results on fiscal years ending June 30.

We are pleased to report that St. John's financial position at June 30, 2025, is improved. Our cash balances increased from \$719,681 at June 30, 2024, to \$1,102,461 at June 30, 2025.

The reasons for this improvement are:

- An operating surplus in the Parish of \$4,128. This surplus is less than principal payments of \$27,878 on the Parish's term loan from the Archdiocesan Parish Revolving Fund ("PRF"). As a result, cash reserves of \$23,751 were used to fully fund principal payments on the PRF Loan.
  - Parish Collections were greater than 2024 by \$37,228 or 4.6%. Collections exceeded the 2025 budget by \$27,004.
  - Overall revenues exceeded 2024 and budget by \$16,701 and \$18,478, respectively.
  - Parish Expenses were greater than budget by \$35,805, primarily because of shared Parish Family 14 costs.
- St. John School had a very strong financial year, posting an operating surplus which was used to pay principal on the School Loan and fund important reserves.
- The Parish and School each received a bequest from a generous Parishioner of \$71,350 (a total of \$142,700).

The Parish budget for 2026 plans for a Surplus of \$28,000 which will be the amount necessary to fund principal payments on our PRF loan. Most importantly the budget reflects an increase in Collection Revenues of 4.6%. As we continue to incur increasing costs due to inflation and our Parish Family operations, your generosity is needed!

I have been reporting to you for many years. In fact, our family will celebrate 50 years in St. John next spring. One constant throughout those years has been the generosity of our Parishioners. That generosity is needed this year more than ever.

Every gift is needed and appreciated. For those of us who are able, we should strive to increase our gifts. If families can begin to participate, that will really help. I have faith that whatever our Parish can do will be enough.

Thank you for your generosity and care.






