FAITH IN FOCUS



MASS DEPENDS on the participation of the priesthood of the faithful, according to the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (5). "The celebration of the Eucharist is the action of the



whole Church." Baptized Christians share in the royal priesthood of God's people. Everyone offers a spiritual sacrifice together with the priest in union with Christ.

"For this people is the People of God, purchased by Christ's Blood, gathered together by the Lord, nourished by his word" (ibid.). When we assemble at church, we come as God's own, a people loved so much that Christ shed blood for us. We gather as people of faith, as people God loves. We listen to God's Word—food for this chosen people.

This people is "called to present to God the prayers of the entire human family" (ibid.). We partake in the General Intercessions, or the Universal Prayer.

We are "a people that gives thanks in Christ for the mystery of salvation by offering his Sacrifice" (ibid.). The priest does not offer this sacrifice alone. All of us do. We all give thanks. Scratch the skin of any Christian and you should find thanksgiving in the blood. We offer the Eucharistic Sacrifice with the priest, giving thanks.

Finally, it is a people "that is brought together in unity by Communion in the Body and Blood of Christ" (ibid.). God's priestly people reach perfection in Communion.

"This people, though holy in its origin, nevertheless grows constantly in holiness by conscious, active, and fruitful participation in the mystery of the Eucharist" (ibid.). When we gather for Mass, we do not merely watch. We do not merely read along. We participate actively and consciously in the mystery around us. And we grow in holiness.

SAINT OF THE MONTH

Saint Veronica Feast Day: July 12 Patron Saint of laundry workers and photographers

We hear the story of Veronica when we pray the Stations of the Cross. At the Sixth Station, Jesus stopped to allow Veronica to wipe the blood, sweat, and dirt from his face. This simple act of kindness is all we know about Veronica, a woman in Jerusalem. She is not mentioned in the Gospels, but Jesus' followers



must have shared the story of her loving care for the Lord so often that it has become part of our tradition.

It is believed that Veronica used her veil to wipe Jesus' face. Afterward, the image of Jesus' face was imprinted on the cloth. Veronica's veil is a treasured Church relic, an object or a personal item of religious importance. According to legend, Veronica later touched Emperor Tiberius with the veil and he was cured of an illness. The veil has been preserved, or safeguarded, in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome since the eighth century.

We do not know if Veronica was a follower of Jesus before the day he was crucified or if she became a Christian because she was a witness to Jesus' suffering. We do know that Veronica responded to Christ on that first Good Friday by reaching out to comfort him.

The Church honors Veronica as a saint. We can imitate her loving and caring actions by doing all we can to help people who are hurting.

Duties are entirely during mass, and do not require early arrival or late departure from mass. All Confirmed Catholics can be Eucharistic ministers. Training will be provided!

Sacristans set God's table. Sacristans arrive 45 minutes – 1 hour prior to mass to prepare the church, and remain after mass to clean the holy materials in the sacristy and set everything back in its place before leaving the church. Responsibilities include turning on the lights, lighting the candles, setting out the vessels and books for the priest to use at mass, assisting during the liturgy if needed by the priest, and supporting the altar servers in their roles. Training will be provided!





BREAKING: Federal court blocks Washington law targeting seal of confession

District judge rules priests cannot be forced to violate sacramental seal

WASHINGTON – A federal court today <u>blocked</u> a new Washington state law that would have forced Catholic priests to face jail time unless they broke the sacred seal of confession. The law at issue in <u>Etienne v. Ferguson</u>, which was set to take effect on July 27, required clergy to report abuse shared within the sacred confines of the confessional. WilmerHale and co-counsel Becket and First Liberty Institute represent the lead plaintiffs Archbishop Paul D. Etienne, Bishop Joseph J. Tyson, and Bishop Thomas A. Daly, who filed an initial lawsuit earlier this summer.

After a July 14 hearing where Washington argued its new law lacked "legislative animus," the court ruled that the state was, "unable to explain why the language in § 1(b) of the bill doubled down on singling out clergy."

As part of its commitment to Safe Environment, the Catholic Church already requires priests to report abuse and neglect to law enforcement and other state authorities. The only exception would be if the information is learned during the sacrament of confession. The new law singles out this specific privilege for religious activities but allows protections to remain in place in secular settings.

For centuries, the Catholic Church has upheld the belief that confession is holy and must stay private. This principle—known as the seal of confession or sacramental seal—requires absolute secrecy from priests about anything said while administering the sacrament. A priest has a sacred obligation to keep everything he hears during the sacrament of confession completely confidential. The seal is so vital to the Catholic faith that any priest who violates it faces automatic excommunication. Over the centuries, priests have been imprisoned, tortured, and even killed for upholding the seal. Penitents today need the same assurance that their participation in a holy sacrament will remain free from government interference.

Washington's new law, which was slated to take effect on July 27, threatened to impose penalties of up to 364 days in jail, a \$5,000 fine, and potential civil liability on priests who uphold the seal of confession and obey God's command. Although the state claims the law was designed to protect minors, it still permits attorneys and others to maintain confidentiality when given identical information.

The Catholic Church in Washington has spent years strengthening its approach to protecting minors and vulnerable adults through its Safe Environment programs, background checks, and reporting policies. Across the Archdiocese of Seattle and the Dioceses of Spokane and Yakima, priests—and all Church personnel—are already required to report suspected abuse to law enforcement or child protection agencies. These policies cover diocesan parishes, schools, and other ministries. The Church supports mandatory reporting except in the narrow instance of the sacrament of confession.
