## **READINGS FOR SUNDAY, AUGUST 3 -** Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**First Reading** All things are vanity!

"Vanity of vanities," we hear right off the bat today, a condemnation of our inclination to labor and obsess over the many material goods we have or hope to accumulate. In the Gospel, Jesus invites us to listen to a parable that addresses this pointless avarice. We get to hear the surprise awaiting the rich man whose harvest was so huge his barns couldn't hold it. In between, we hear Saint Paul's advice to the Colossians: "seek what is above." It's too late for the rich man in Jesus' parable, but it's always timely advice for us.





#### Sancta Vita

"If it is true that the weakness of the elderly needs the strength of the young, it is equally true that the inexperience of the young needs the witness of the elderly in order to build the future with wisdom. How often our grandparents have been for us examples of faith and devotion, civic virtue and social commitment, memory and perseverance amid trials! The precious legacy that they have handed down to us with hope and love will always be a source of gratitude and a summons to perseverance. Pope Francis wanted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly to be celebrated primarily through an effort to seek out elderly persons who are living alone. For this reason, those who are unable to come to Rome on pilgrimage during this Holy Year may "obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if they visit, for an appropriate amount of time, the elderly who are alone... making, in a sense, a pilgrimage to Christ present in them (cf. 

## **FAITH IN FOCUS**



THE BOOK of the Gospels is a collection of Gospel passages proclaimed at Mass. It is an excerpt of the lectionary, usually containing the Gospels for Sundays and solemnities, and decorated with dignity. It does not contain the entire texts of all four Gospels. The words of Jesus are highly esteemed by Christians, so the Book of the Gospels receives more respect than other volumes of the lectionary.



It is not required to use of the *Book of the Gospels* at Mass, but it is recommended. This book—not the lectionary—may be carried in the Entrance Procession by a deacon, or by a reader when there is no deacon. The minister walks with the book slightly elevated and places it upon the altar, which represents Christ, the living stone (1 Peter 2:4). This placement unifies two primary symbols for Christ from the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

During the Gospel Acclamation, the deacon or priest goes to the altar, lifts the *Book of the Gospels*, and carries it to the ambo. He may incense the book after announcing the evangelist. He proclaims the Gospel and then kisses the book. If a bishop presides, the deacon who proclaims the Gospel carries the *Book of the Gospels* to the bishop for him to kiss. The bishop may then grasp the book and bless the people by making the Sign of the Cross with it. Afterward, the book may be placed on the credence table or in some other worthy place.

During the ordination of a deacon, the *Book of the Gospels* is placed briefly in his hands. During the ordination of a bishop, the *Book of the Gospels* is briefly laid upon his head.

#### SAINT OF THE MONTH

**Saint Veronica Feast Day: July 12** Patron Saint of laundry workers and photographers

We hear the story of Veronica when we pray the Stations of the Cross. At the Sixth Station, Jesus stopped to allow Veronica to wipe the blood, sweat, and dirt from his face. This simple act of kindness is all we know about Veronica, a woman in Jerusalem. She is not mentioned in the Gospels, but Jesus' followers



must have shared the story of her loving care for the Lord so often that it has become part of our tradition.

It is believed that Veronica used her veil to wipe Jesus' face. Afterward, the image of Jesus' face was imprinted on the cloth. Veronica's veil is a treasured Church relic, an object or a personal item of religious importance. According to legend, Veronica later touched Emperor Tiberius with the veil and he was cured of an illness. The veil has been preserved, or safeguarded, in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome since the eighth century.

We do not know if Veronica was a follower of Jesus before the day he was crucified or if she became a Christian because she was a witness to Jesus' suffering. We do know that Veronica responded to Christ on that first Good Friday by reaching out to comfort him.

The Church honors Veronica as a saint. We can imitate her loving and caring actions by doing all we can to help people who are hurting.

### Meet Fr. Nkolombidzo (en-colom-beads-o): Our Parish Family's New Parochial Vicar

Fr. Nkolombidzo is a priest from the Archdiocese of Blantyre in Malawi, born on January 7, 1981. He grew up in a poor village deeply influenced by the life and ministry of his parish pastor, a Belgian Montfort Missionary who dedicated his life to serving the people of the surrounding villages. This missionary priest not only nurtured the spiritual life of the community but also worked tirelessly to improve living conditions by building schools, a technical college, and a hospital. His example inspired Fr. Nkolombidzo to pursue the priesthood.

At the age of 13, Fr. Nkolombidzo entered Pius XII Minor Seminary. After five years of formation, he continued his studies at St. Anthony – Kachebere Major Seminary and later at St. Peter's Major Seminary, where he studied Theology. He was ordained to the priesthood on July 18, 2009, at Kamuzu Stadium in Blantyre.



Fr. Nkolombidzo is passionate about community engagement and development. Drawing from his own experience of growing up in poverty, he founded a banana plantation cooperative aimed at enhancing food security for poor households by offering a sustainable alternative to maize, Malawi's staple crop. He also established an irrigation scheme in partnership with small Christian communities to help mitigate the effects of drought in areas dependent on rain-fed agriculture.

His interests include community involvement, reading, writing, volunteering, music, travel, culture, and leadership development. Fr. Nkolombidzo continues to be a compassionate and visionary leader, committed to both the spiritual and practical upliftment of the communities he serves.

We are blessed to welcome Fr. Nkolombidzo as the new Parochial Vicar of our Parish Family!



# POPE LEO XIV

## The First American Pope

On Thursday, May 8th 2025, Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, O.S.A., became the first American and the first Augustinian Pope. He was born on September 14, 1955, in Chicago to Louis Marius Prevost and Mildred Martínez. He has two older brothers, Louis Martín and John Joseph, and is of African, French, Italian, and Spanish descent.

After high school he attended Villanova University earning a degree in Mathematics (1977). He then entered the Order of St. Augustine and studied theology first at the Catholic Theological Union in Chicago (1978–82) and then Canon Law in Rome (1982–87) where he was ordained a priest on June 19, 1982.

From 1988–99 he served in the Augustinian mission in Trujillo, Peru, both in various Augustinian offices: prior of the community, formation director, and instructor for professed members, and for the diocese as judicial vicar and professor of Canon Law, Patristics, and Moral Theology at the Major Seminary, all the while doing pastoral ministry for Saint Rita parish in a poor suburb of the city.

In 1999 he returned to Chicago to serve as Provincial Prior and then Prior General of the whole Augustinian Order (2001–13). He returned to Peru and in 2015 Pope Francis made him Bishop of Chiclayo. Pope Leo claimed that "The part of my ministry that most shaped my life was Peru. I was there for over 20 years total."

In 2023 Pope Francis named him a Cardinal to head the Curia office for choosing new bishops. As Pope Leo later explained, "he called me specifically because he didn't want someone from the Roman Curia to take on this role. He wanted a missionary. He wanted someone from outside. He wanted someone who would come in with a different perspective and assist him in a very specific ministry."

Leo's life experience of service to the Church both in administration as pastor, prior, provincial, Prior General, Bishop and Cardinal and in his missionary work as pastor, teacher and friend of the poor, well suits him now to face the challenges of his new role as Pope.



#### POPE LEO'S COAT OF ARMS

Pope Leo XIV's coat of arms reflects his desire to promote love for Jesus, veneration of Mary, and unity within the Church. It embodies both his personal faith and his Augustinian spiritual heritage.

Behind the shield appears the papal silver mitre symbolizing his papal office. It has three gold bands reminiscent of the traditional elaborate bejeweled triple tiara (crown) no longer worn by popes. It also has two fluttering red streamers fringed with gold and

adorned with gold crosses. The crossed gold and silver Petrine keys linked by a red cord symbolize his papal authority (Mt 16:19).

The shield is divided diagonally into two sections, the upper blue background recalls the heights of the heavens and displays a lily or fleur-de-lis symbolizing the Blessed Virgin Mary. The lower half has a light background displaying an image familiar to the Order of Saint Augustine: a closed book with a heart pierced by an arrow, recalling St. Augustine's personal encounter with God's Word using the phrase: "You have pierced my heart with your Word." The Latin motto, "In Illo uno unum" ("In the one Christ we are one"), is taken from St. Augustine's sermon on the Exposition on Psalm 127, explaining that "although we Christians are many, in the one Christ we are one."

**First American-Born Pope:** The first pope born in the USA.

**Dual Citizenship**: Holds US and Peruvian citizenship due to extensive missionary work in Peru during the 1980s and 1990s.

Math Whiz: Earned a Bachelor's in mathematics from Villanova University in 1977.

White Sox (and Bears) Fan: Lifelong supporter of the Chicago White Sox, he attended Game 1 of their 2005 World Series victory.

**Tennis Enthusiast:** An amateur tennis player, he's expressed interest in hitting with proffesional players.

**Multilingual**: Speaks English, Spanish, Italian, French, Portuguese, German, and reads Latin.

Wordle Player: Plays Wordle and Words with Friends with his brothers.

**Car Enthusiast:** Loves driving long distances and fixing cars, a skill he used as a missionary in Peru.

**First Augustinian Pope**: First pope from the Order of Saint Augustine.

**Canon Law Expert**: Holds a doctorate in canon law from Rome, with a thesis on Augustinian leadership roles.
