





# **READINGS FOR SUNDAY, AUGUST 31 -** Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### First Reading

Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29

Ancient wisdom insists that the more humble we are, the greater we are.

Far from frightening, our encounter with God will be like a glorious holiday.

Jesus presents his own version of table manners.

The virtue of humility is extolled throughout today's readings. Sirach teaches, "Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God" (Sirach 3:18). The psalmist writes that God makes a home for the poor, orphans, widows, prisoners, and the forsaken. Though not directly mentioning humility, the author of Hebrews alludes to the signs of the old and new covenants, which leave us humbled. Finally, Jesus teaches the Pharisees that God exalts those who humble themselves. May God's word inspire us to embrace humility.

### **FAITH IN FOCUS**



THE CHASUBLE is the large outer garment a priest wears at Mass. Only a priest (or bishop) wears one and only at Mass. The single exception is on Good



Friday, when we have no Mass, but the priest who presides at the service of the Lord's Passion wears the chasuble, linking the services from Holy Thursday to Easter. Its color announces the season or feast.

This odd word comes from the Latin *casula*, meaning "little house." Some of these garments seem ample enough to house a family of six. Originally, the casula was an outer cloak or jacket worn by men or women as secular dress on cool days. It was formed by two quarter-circles of cloth stitched together front and back. In liturgical usage, the seams became decorated. In time, the seams moved to the sides but the decorations remained, making the chasuble a portable billboard of liturgical symbolism, ranging from the tasteful to the absurd.

During the Middle Ages, the priest started saying Mass with his back to the people and introduced the elevation of the host and chalice so everyone could see over his head. Fashion-minded presiders noted that the old garment did not function well for the elevation; it bunched up the sleeves and pulled at the bottom. So chasubles became sleeveless, if you will, and servers began lifting up the bottom at genuflections, like bridesmaids tending the train.

The stole, traditionally worn underneath the chasuble, is sometimes seen on top. It makes more visible the distinction between the stoles of the priest and the deacon and creates new opportunities for design, but the results do not always satisfy. A stole external to the chasuble is new in the history of vestments, so instructions on the practice are scarce.

Although designs today run freely through a variety of shapes, colors, and patterns, the basic simplicity of the vestment remains. Priests concelebrating Mass may wear an alb and stole without the chasuble if they prefer. The presider may also wear a combination alb-chasuble with an external stole for certain occasions or groups. But the principal symbolic vesture for a presider at Mass is the chasuble—a "house" the Word of God inhabits, a cloak for the spiritual journey and a sign of our leader's role.

#### SAINT OF THE MONTH

Saint Monica (331-387) Feast Day: August 27

Patron Saint of wives and abuse victims

Saint Monica, also known as Monica of Hippo, is St. Augustine of Hippo's mother. She was born in 331 A.D. in Tagaste, which is present-day Algeria.



As was customary, Monica married a man that her family had chosen for her. Together they had three children. But Monica's was not a happy marriage. Her husband, Patricius, was an unkind man. He had a violent temper and also had a habit of wasting all of their money.

Despite his faults, Monica loved her husband. She dreamed of a better life for herself and her children. Monica had always been very religious and turned to God in her time of need. She was determined that her husband and children should become Christians.

At first, Monica's husband was completely against the idea. He believed he had no need to know God. But soon, Monica's devotion to her faith moved her husband, and he agreed to be baptized. Monica's son Augustine was enrolled as a catechumen as young child. It was the custom in those days to delay Baptism for infants and children; they were baptized later in life.

As a young man Augustine was not interested in God or religion, in fact he led a rather corrupt life. Monica prayed for him every day—for more than 17 years! Finally he changed his life and agreed to be baptized. Later, he would become one of the foremost religious people of his time. His writings are still studied today. Augustine was made a saint in his own right.

Monica died in 387, and had it not been for her dedication and devotion, the world may not have ever known St. Augustine.
