

We are happy to announce expanded confession times to better serve our Parish Family!




Beginning Saturday, September 13, confession schedules will be as follows:

FAITH IN FOCUS



NEWLY BAPTIZED persons each receive a lighted candle. The candle signifies that they have been enlightened by Christ and are to walk in his light until they meet him in heaven.

Any candle will do. It may be a plain taper, or it may bear elaborate decoration. Some parishes obtain special Baptism candles fashioned in the style of the Easter candle. Others invite families to decorate their own.

The Baptism candle is lighted from the Easter candle, which burns at every Mass throughout the Easter season and at every Baptism and funeral throughout the year. Whenever Baptism takes place, the Easter candle will stand lighted before the ceremony begins. Shortly after a person is baptized, the priest or deacon holds the Easter candle or at least touches it and says to the newly baptized, "Receive the light of Christ."

Someone lights the Baptism candle. Usually a godparent does this, but a parent or another family member may do it for a newly baptized infant. The father and godfather are specifically mentioned as possible helpers.

The priest or deacon then explains the significance of the candle as it is entrusted to the parents and godparents of an infant or handed by the godparent to a newly baptized adult. These new Christians are enlightened by Christ. They are to walk always as children of the light, keeping the flame of faith alive within them. When the Lord comes at the end of time, the baptized will go out to meet him, just as the wise virgins, torches alight, went out to meet the bridegroom in Jesus' parable.

Many people keep their candles and relight them for prayer at home on the anniversary of their Baptisms.

SAINT OF THE MONTH

Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati (Apr 6, 1901 - Jul 4, 1925) Feast Day: July 4

Pier was born in Turin, Italy, in 1901. His mother was an artist and his father founded and ran the Italian newspaper *La Stampa*.

As he was growing up, Pier developed two habits that became part of his everyday life.

He went to Mass daily to receive the Eucharist, and he also

prayed the Rosary. He never hesitated to share his faith with others. Pier had a great concern for the poor, even as a child. One day a needy mother with a young son came to the Frassati home to beg for food. Pier noticed that the child was barefoot. He took off his own shoes and gave them to the boy, and then he and his mother fed the poor family. Pier used the money he got as a graduation gift to rent a room for a woman who had been evicted from her apartment because she had no money. He gave away his allowance to the poor, and sometime he chose to walk home from school because he gave the money for his bus or train fare to someone in need.

He joined the St. Vincent de Paul Society as a young man and spent hours on activities that helped the poor and sick. As a mining engineer, he cared deeply about the rights of the miners. He wanted them to have just working conditions and fair wages.

When he was 24, Pier became very ill with polio. Some people said he got this disease from caring for people in the slums of Turin, but Pier saw Jesus in the people he served. In his last days, he whispered the names of people who still needed assistance to his family and friends who gathered at his bedside. He died on July 4, 1925.

Peter was declared "Blessed" in 1990 by Pope John Paul II, who called him a "man of the Beatitudes" and a "joyful apostle of Christ." Many people were surprised that the Vatican created an official portrait of him for his beatification that showed him outdoors, leaning on an ice axe, with one foot on a rock, in honor of his youthful vitality and his love of the mountains.




