

"What Are Our Gifts?" LISTENING SESSIONS

We have recently completed several listening sessions to identify the unique gifts and talents of each of our parishes. Initial sessions were held after each Mass during the weekend of October 25-26, with additional sessions for St. Benedict on October 30 at the school cafeteria, for young adults on November 7 at St. Alphonsus Gym, and for St. Alphonsus on November 13 and 14 at the School Commons.

In parallel, our online and paper surveys remain open for anyone who was unable to attend the listening sessions.

Once all sessions are completed and survey responses have been collected, Fr. Parrish and the Parish Leadership Council will meet to review and discuss the listening session process, results, and feedback. A summary of each parish's gifts and talents will also be shared through our bulletins and newsletters.

Looking ahead, we will discern how our Parish Family can use these gifts to creatively serve the unique needs of our community, which may include new outreach efforts, youth ministry programs, evangelization initiatives, and more.







Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Our first reading today takes us back to when the elders of the twelve tribes of Israel anointed David king. In the second reading we hear an early church prayer, extolling Jesus in words like the ones we recite today in the creed. The Gospel offers two very different ways in which the men condemned with Jesus viewed the inscription on his cross. In harmony with the good thief, may we sing out in today's responsorial psalm, "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."






Those who have experienced a loss by suicide are invited to attend a 7-week grief support group.

FAITH IN FOCUS



AS THE Church year draws to its close, it is likely that Catholics attending Sunday Mass will hear a second reading from one of



St. Paul's two letters to the Thessalonians. Excerpts from the First Letter are proclaimed through a stretch of four Sundays near the end of the lectionary's Year A, and passages from the Second Letter are heard on three Sundays near the end of Year C.

Many scholars believe that these were Paul's first efforts at writing epistles. They also believe that the Gospels were first written down some decades after Paul died. Therefore, the First Letter to the Thessalonians is probably the oldest written book of the New Testament, dating to about AD 50.

The city of Thessaloniki still stands as a large important port in Greece, the populous center of Macedonia. Paul had visited there on his missionary journeys, where he and Silas won over many Jewish and Gentile converts, both men and women. He also made some enemies, and this perhaps convinced him to stay in touch with the flock he formed.

The letters reveal a belief that Jesus' return was imminent. They also comfort readers with a message about the salvation of believers who have already died. These themes make the letters particularly appropriate for the end of the Church year, when the faithful turn their attention to the Second Coming of Christ. Passages from the First Letter to the Thessalonians also appear on a Sunday of Advent in Years B and C, and as one option for a reading at funerals.

Although Paul was wrong about how quickly Christ would return, these letters remind us to behave our best at all times —as though the end is near.

SAINT OF THE MONTH

Martin de Porres Feast Day: November 3 Beatified: October 29, 1837

Some people do good no matter what happens to them. Martin de Porres did. His mother was an African or Indian from Panama, a former slave. His father was a Spanish soldier and nobleman. So people made fun of Martin because he came from two different races.



What did Martin do? He blessed his enemies; he did good to those who laughed at him. Was this easy? No. But Martin simply loved to do good.

Martin was born in Lima, Peru, in 1579. His father left his family when Martin was eight. This left Martin and his baby sister and their mother very poor. But Martin still gave away whatever he could to other hungry and poor people.

When he was 12, Martin went to work for a barber. He learned to cut hair and to heal wounds. Later, Martin wanted to join the Dominicans in their work. He was allowed to work with them as a servant who swept floors and answered the door (at the time, the law in Peru did not allow persons of other races or mixed race to enter religious life). Finally his years of good works and miraculous cures led the Dominicans to allow him to become a lay brother, but even some of his fellow Dominicans still scorned him.

He eventually founded orphanages for homeless children and cared for lonely African slaves who had been forced to come to Lima. He gave shirts to those who had no clothes; bread to those who had no food; shelter to those who had no homes. One of his closest friends was St. Rose of Lima.

In 1639, Martin died. Everyone in Lima mourned him, even bishops and members of the royal court in Lima. In 1962, the Church declared that Martin de Porres was a saint. Many statues of St. Martin de Porres show him holding a broom, with a dog, cat, and mouse at his feet; he loved animals and was said to have solved a rat problem by simply asking the rats to leave. The house where he was born has been well preserved in Lima.

He is the patron saint of persons of mixed race and of those who suffer from discrimination.
