Living the Sacred Heart Devotion



The goal of the Sacred Heart Devotion is to grow deeper in our relationship with Jesus and transform our hearts through his abundant love and mercy.

Five ways to grow closer to Jesus through his Sacred Heart

1 Place an image of the Sacred Heart in your home

Keeping Jesus Christ at the center of our lives is an important part of the Sacred Heart Devotion. Placing an image or statue of the Sacred Heart in your home, also called enthronement, is one way to remind us of his love and is an important element of the devotion. When enthroning the image in your home, use a Sacred Heart enthronement prayer*, and place the image where you can light a candle or place a flower to pray.

2 Pray

Memorize a Sacred Heart prayer. Knowing prayers by heart means we carry them with us everywhere whether we're waiting in line or sitting in traffic. Here are some simple prayers:

- Morning Offering* to the Sacred Heart
- Jesus, gentle and humble of heart, touch our hearts and make them like your own.
- Heart of Jesus, I put my trust in you.
- Sacred Heart of Jesus, let me love you and make you loved.

There are also the Sacred Heart Novena, Sacred Heart Litany and other prayers.

3 Attend First Friday Mass and Adoration

The First Friday of each month has been set aside as a time to embrace the devotion to the Sacred Heart and receive the Eucharist. In addition to First Fridays, take part in Holy Hours and Adoration focusing on love of Christ. As St. John Henry Newman prayed: "O most Sacred, most loving Heart of Jesus, Thou art concealed in the Holy Eucharist, and Thou beatest for us still... O make my heart beat with Thy Heart."

4 Read Scripture

Reflect on the Gospels and words of our Savior. One easy way to start this habit is to read the daily Gospel reading available from the USCCB.org or on apps like Hallow. Pope Francis wrote "The Sacred Heart is a synthesis of the Gospel" (*Dilexit Nos*, 83). Pray with the Scriptures, reading and meditating on them in light of the love and mercy of Christ.

5 Perform works of mercy

When we perform the works of mercy, the love of Christ comes to life in us. As Pope Leo XIV wrote, "Works of mercy are recommended as a sign of the authenticity of worship, which, while giving praise to God, has the task of opening us to the transformation that the Spirit can bring about in us, so that we may all become an image of Christ and his mercy towards the weakest" (*Dilexi te*, 27). Look for ways to bring Christ's mercy to others by serving others through your parish, school or community.

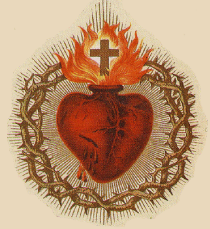

READINGS FOR SUNDAY, JUNE 14 - Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading

God makes the Israelites a holy nation.

Exodus 19:2–6a

The Israelites have been God's chosen people from the time of Abraham and Sarah, "dearer to me than all other people," as the LORD tells Moses in the first reading. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples that he was sent to return "the lost sheep of the house of Israel" to the fold. We are part of that fold now, "the sheep of his flock," as we sing in the psalm. Optional Memorial

SOME PEOPLE VISITED celebrate birthdays. Others don't. The day has real significance for some people, but not for others. However, the birthdays of George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, and Martin Luther King Jr. have taken on national importance. Everybody celebrates those.



On our Church calendar, we have a number of days set aside as memorials to honor our saints. Some of them—such as Thomas Aquinas (January 28), Augustine (August 28), and St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus (October 1)—are so important that everybody celebrates them. Others—such as Rose of Lima (August 23), Turibius de Mogrovejo (March 23), and Elizabeth of Portugal (July 4)—are significant for smaller groups. When these days fall during the week, the Mass contains special prayers to honor these saints. Although every church celebrates the days of certain saints as memorials, the days of other saints are optional memorials. Your own parish church may choose whether or not to celebrate those days.

Some optional memorials are quite popular. For example, Patrick (March 17), Nicholas (December 6), and Maria Goretti (July 6) have many followers. Other saints are more obscure.

Because of the large number of saints, the calendar includes some flexibility. It adapts to local devotions and to the spiritual needs of worshippers.

When an optional memorial falls on a weekday, you need not celebrate it at all. You may just have an ordinary day. But when your parish chooses to take the option at a weekday Mass, you may hear prayers that pertain directly to the saint, especially the Collect (Opening Prayer) of the liturgy. The Scriptures may also vary to help people reflect on the special gifts and devotion of the saint. Whenever an optional memorial coincides with a Sunday or another day of higher rank on the calendar, we omit its celebration that year.

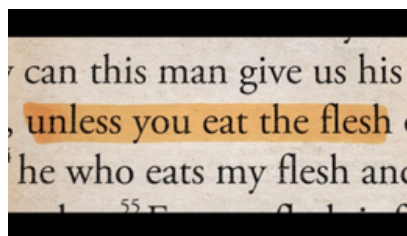

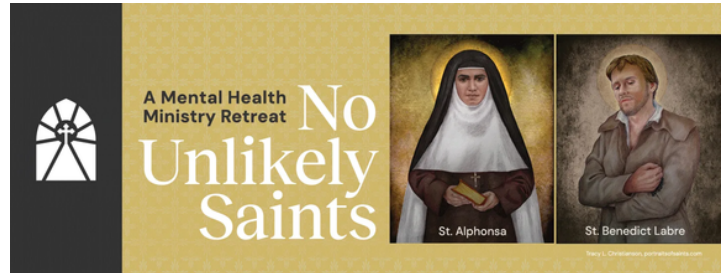

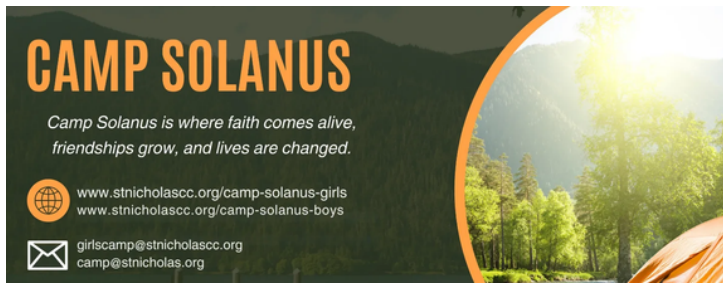
