


Third Sunday of Advent December 14, 2025 Vigil and 8:30am Mass

For Baptisms at the Vigil Mass, the service begins at the back of the church where Father receives each child and asks each set of parents and godparents to commit themselves to the ongoing faith formation of the children in the tradition of the Church.

Father then signs each child with the Sign of the Cross.

Priest: [*Greets the congregation.*] **Response:** And with your spirit.


The Penitential Rite is omitted for Masses where Baptisms occur.

NICENE CREED The Creed is omitted for Masses where Baptisms occur.


I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

Each newly baptized child is then *anointed with the Sacred Chrism* so that he/she may be forever united with God's people in Christ. Then each child *receives a White Garment*; a symbol that he/she is risen with Christ and is clothed in His protective love. Finally, godparents *light the Baptismal Candle* from the Paschal Candle, which reminds the newly baptized of the light of Christ they have received. The celebrant then touches the ears and mouth of each child with his thumb (ephphatha – "be opened").


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LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS - Bread & wine are brought to the altar and the priest prepares these gifts. Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming 438 (red)



While the congregation sings, the priest says the prayer of preparation, blessing and thanking God for the gifts of bread and wine.

Response: We lift them up to the Lord.


Response: It is right and just.

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The priest implores the power of the Holy Spirit that the gifts offered by human hands become Christ's Body and Blood, to be consumed in Communion for the salvation of those who will partake of it.

Sanctus is from the Latin, meaning "Holy."








Response: Amen.


Priest: ...The Peace of the Lord be with you always. **Response:** And with your spirit.

KNEEL


Priest: ...Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

Shepherd of Souls 941 (red)


