

[All make the sign of the cross.] Response: Amen.

Priest: [*Greets the congregation.*] **Response:** And with your spirit.

CONFITEOR


Priest: May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS - Bread & wine are brought to the altar and Priest prepares these gifts. The King of Love My Shepherd Is 712 (red)



While the congregation sings, the priest says the prayer of preparation, blessing and thanking God for the gifts of bread and wine.

STAND

Priest: Pray, brethren (brothers and sisters), that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

[The priest says a prayer over the offerings.]

Priest: The Lord be with you. **Priest:** Lift up your hearts.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God. [*The priest continues the Eucharistic prayer.*]

Response: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his holy Church.

Response: Amen.

Response: And with your spirit. **Response:** We lift them up to the Lord.


Response: It is right and just.

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The priest implores the power of the Holy Spirit that the gifts offered by human hands become Christ's Body and Blood, to be consumed in Communion for the salvation of those who will partake of it.

SANCTUS

Sanctus is from the Latin, meaning "Holy."



Hosanna is a liturgical word from Hebrew meaning "praise" or "adoration."

KNEEL

Priest: ...Let us proclaim the mystery of faith.

MEMORIAL ACCLAMATION



Priest: ...Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever.

COMMUNION RITE

LORD'S PRAYER

Priest: ...[Invites all to say the Lord's Prayer.]

Response: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Priest: ...Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Response: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever.

SIGN OF PEACE

Priest: ...Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles, Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign for ever and ever.

Response: Amen.


Priest: ...The Peace of the Lord be with you always. **Response:** And with your spirit.

Priest: ...Let us offer each other a sign of peace.

[All the people exchange an embrace, handshake, or other appropriate gesture of peace with those near them.]

LAMB OF GOD





KNEEL

Priest: ...Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

Response: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

[&]quot;The Eucharistic bread and wine offered during mass have great significance for Catholics as the Body and Blood of Christ. If you do not share our Catholic Faith, or find yourself out of true communion with the Church, we invite you to come forward and receive a blessing by placing crossed hands over your heart."

Come, You Sinners, Poor and Needy 962 (red)




-When you return to your pew you may kneel or be seated.
