We offer an airport transfer service from the Clarence Valley to Ballina Byron Gateway Airport or Coffs Harbour Airport and return through A2B Transport Solutions. This is a door to door prepaid, vehicle hire service.

Services are provided for medical transport (travel to specialists, hospital admission and discharge, allied

health, pathology, dentists, medical centres, general practitioners, health clinics, tests such as X-rays and scans).

We also provide services for shopping trips, bus transport and social outings.

This service is for any person in the community who wishes to receive meals home delivered by our volunteers in Iluka, Maclean & Yamba areas.

Although meals are available to everyone, you may be eligible for subsidised meals if you have been assessed by My Aged Care.

Did you know, Connect You Too offers a monthly shopping bus to various locations including Lismore, Coffs Harbour, Tweed City and Robina? They depart Yamba, Maclean and Iluka once a month.

Did you know, Connect You Too offers a fortnightly shopping bus to Yamba Fair for customers in the Maclean and Yamba areas?

Did you know, Connect You Too offers fortnightly shopping buses to Grafton Shoppingworld? They travel to Grafton from Glenreagh on Mondays; from Iluka on Wednesdays; from Brooms Head and Wooli on Thursdays and from Maclean and Yamba on Fridays.


During the past financial year, Connect You Too transported 4,715 customers on social trips and 7,873 customers on shopping trips.

NSW MEALS ON WHEELS

Banana Cake

INGREDIENTS

- 75g butter
- 200g brown sugar
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp vanilla essence
- 2 large ripe bananas, mashed
- 1 1/4 cups self-raising flour, sifted
- 40mls cup milk
- 375mls thickened cream, to serve

METHOD

Preheat fan-forced oven to 170°C (180°C for conventional oven).

In a large saucepan over medium heat, melt the butter and sugar, and add cinnamon and vanilla essence. Remove from heat.

Add mashed bananas and stir through until combined.

Add eggs and mix well. Stir in the sifted flour, and gently fold in the milk.

Transfer the mix to a large, greased baking tray and bake for

RANDOM TRIVIA

Types of wine bottles

Wine bottles in a single-serving size are both convenient and cute, but if they can go to a tiny 187.5mL piccolo (the smallest bottle's official name), why not go large? Like 15-litres large. And we're here for the bigger, maybe better, but definitely impressive.

The first of the recognisably large variety is the magnum. Holding the equivalent of two wine bottles, this is an excellent size for a full dinner table or party. Whether you're tempted by the grandeur, or simply keen on this crowd-pleasing size, there are so many reasons to reach for one. Then there's the double magnum (also known as a Jeroboam) and no prize for guessing how big that is – three litres (twice the size of a magnum). Then there's a minor 4.5 litres of Jeroboam. Confusingly, this is the same name, but here it's meant for still wine as opposed to Champagne.

The next in line is the Methuselah (or Imperial, which is reserved for still wine). Holding a hefty six litres, things then start to increase in multiples of three litres. It jumps to nine litres with the Salmanazar, then 12 with the Balthazar, 15 with the Nebuchadnezzar, and then we hit the equivalent of a whopping 26 bottles of wine in the Solomon. No small feat, this bottle stands at around 85cm. To avoid getting lost in even more wacky names, the largest one we'll leave you with is the Melchizedek, which is nothing less than an enormous 30 litres, or 40 standard bottles. It's the perfect choice to share with 100 of your closest friends – and 100 of theirs, too.

If you're thinking these names sound ancient, you'd be right. Most are biblical kings and historical figures, hence the capital letters. Nebuchadnezzar was a King of Babylon, Balthazar was one of the Three Wise Kings in the nativity scene, and Methuselah, according to legend, lived for more than 900 years.
