

Company is Coming for Christmas "Paving the Way from the Parking Lot to the Pew"

At Holy Innocents & St. Anthony we are known for our hospitality. Below are a few tips on how we can all help to create a warm and welcoming place for everyone who will worship with us this Christmas. Thank you for your participation.

- Consider parking in the far parking spots when you arrive to make room up close for visitors
- Consider sitting up front to allow more room in back of Church
- Consider welcoming those whom you find sitting in your regular spot in the pew
- Communicate the Love of Christ by being as welcoming to visitors at Mass as we would be to visitors in our own homes.
- Recognize that one way to evangelize is to accept people as they are, especially those who only show up once or twice a year.
- Finally, **pray for our parish family**, that our hearts would be broken open with kindness and generosity as we welcome our visitors this Christmas and **pray that the Holy Spirit would inspire those people with courage who are feeling called to come worship with us**.



Baptism

The celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism for infants is scheduled after the baptismal preparation for the parents is completed. Baptisms are normally celebrated at a Sunday mass in the parish where the parents live. Adults (7 years or older) seeking baptism or confirmation are invited to inquire at the parish office for information about adult preparation.

Marriage

Couples seeking marriage in the church are asked to contact the parish at least four months in advance of their proposed wedding date. For those with prior marriages, additional time may be required. Marriages are celebrated in the parish in which one of the Catholic parties lives.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

Private confession is available every Friday evening 6:00 — 6:45 pm.

Pastoral Care for the Sick and Dying In the case of serious illness or failing health due to old age, parishioners should ask the church for the Sacrament of Anointing. This sacrament is administered by a priest and is celebrated by appointment as necessary. When a parishioner is near death, they should receive Holy Communion, called Viaticum (food for the journey). This sacrament can be administered by a priest or deacon or Eucharistic minister.

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection

December 21, 2025 — Fourth Sunday in Advent
IS 7:10-14, 10; PS 24:1-6; ROM 1:1-7; MT 1:18-24



As our Advent preparations end and Christmas fast approaches, it is fitting that today's readings demonstrate the intensity of the Father's perfect and passionate love for each of us, culminating in the gift of His own Son, Jesus Christ, on Christmas Day.



In response to such an overwhelming gift, what can we do except offer our lives as gift in return, embracing a stewardship way of life with all the love and strength we have to give?

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, we find an unparalleled example of one who embraced this way of life in St. Joseph, as he obeys God's call to him through the message of an angel.

We never hear St. Joseph speak, but the Scriptures tell us he was always listening, attentive to the leading of the Holy Spirit for his family. It was Joseph who found the stable where the baby Jesus would be born. No doubt it was Joseph who cleaned it up and prepared it for Mary and Jesus since we know that Mary was about to give birth. Joseph protected the family, guarded them, and tended to their safety, their comfort, and their well-being at the expense of his own plans and preferences. Though we do not hear any words from St. Joseph his actions clearly show that he offered himself, his whole life, as a gift to his family through his strong guidance, protection, and service.

Let us imitate St. Joseph, then, as good stewards, giving our very lives to those around us in love and gratitude to God, who has given us everything we have, especially His own Son, Jesus Christ.
