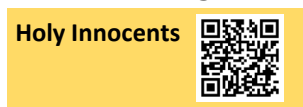

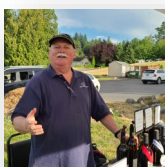

Prayer Chain

Baptism

The celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism for infants is scheduled after the baptismal preparation for the parents is completed. Baptisms are normally celebrated at a Sunday mass in the parish where the parents live. Adults (7 years or older) seeking baptism or confirmation are invited to inquire at the parish office for information about adult preparation.

Marriage

Couples seeking marriage in the church are asked to contact the parish at least four months in advance of their proposed wedding date. For those with prior marriages, additional time may be required. Marriages are celebrated in the parish in which one of the Catholic parties lives.

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

Private confession is available every Friday evening 6:00 pm — 6:45 pm.

Pastoral Care for the Sick and Dying In the case of serious illness or failing health due to old age, parishioners should ask the church for the Sacrament of Anointing. This sacrament is administered by a priest and is celebrated by appointment as necessary. When a parishioner is near death, they should receive Holy Communion, called Viaticum (food for the journey). This sacrament can be administered by a priest or deacon or Eucharistic minister.

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection

July 13, 2025

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

DT 30:10-14; PS 69:14,17,30-31, 33-34, 36, 37 or PS 19:8-11;

COL 1:15-20; LK 10: 25-37



In today's Gospel passage, from Luke, we read the well-known parable of the Good Samaritan. Here,

Jesus teaches us in rich detail what stewardship in action looks like. In fact, this parable could just as accurately be called the parable of the Good Steward.

The first thing we note about the Good Samaritan is that he is aware of the needs of those around him and responds generously. While the priest and Levi brush right past the man on the side of the road, the Samaritan is watching for those who might be in need. He has a hospitable way of looking at the world around him and so he is able to "see" in a way that the others did not, and he was "moved with compassion at the sight" of the man.

Next, we see the Good Samaritan spring into action to serve this man, setting aside his own schedule and plans to meet his needs. He does not just give the man a few dollars or offer quick words of encouragement from across the road. He goes right up to the man. He cleans and bandages his wounds. He puts the man on his own animal and brings him to an inn where he can heal. He ensures the innkeeper would continue to look after him, and he commits to re-turning to the man on his way back.

That is how we live out God's commandments.

That is true hospitality and service.

That is how a good steward springs into action when he comes upon a neighbor in need. And Jesus says to each of us personally, just as He did in today's Gospel, "Go and do likewise."

Take God with You this Summer

This passage is very familiar so it requires careful attention. The Samaritan who approached the victim was not a friend or neighbor. So why did he stop when others didn't? because he was "moved with compassion," which means "to suffer with." The Samaritan saw his own vulnerability in another human being who was suffering and tried to ease that suffering.

Family Reflection:

- Who do I know is suffering today? Remember to include them in your prayers.
- According to the Gospel today, how do you define neighbor?

Faith in Action:

Consider borrowing from the library, the children's book entitled The Three Questions by Jon J. Muth and read it together. It is based on a story by Leo Tolstoy that asks three questions: When is the best time to do things? Who is the most important one? What is the right thing to do? Talk about this together and
