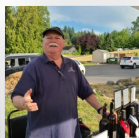
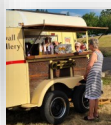

## Baptism

The celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism for infants is scheduled after the baptismal preparation for the parents is completed. Baptisms are normally celebrated at a Sunday mass in the parish where the parents live. Adults (7 years or older) seeking baptism or confirmation are invited to inquire at the parish office for information about adult preparation.

## Marriage

Couples seeking marriage in the church are asked to contact the parish at least four months in advance of their proposed wedding date. For those with prior marriages, additional time may be required. Marriages are celebrated in the parish in which one of the Catholic parties lives.

## Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

Private confession is available every Friday evening 6:00 pm — 6:45 pm.

**Pastoral Care for the Sick and Dying** In the case of serious illness or failing health due to old age, parishioners should ask the church for the Sacrament of Anointing. This sacrament is administered by a priest and is celebrated by appointment as necessary. When a parishioner is near death, they should receive Holy Communion, called Viaticum (food for the journey). This sacrament can be administered by a priest or deacon or Eucharistic minister.

## Stewardship Bulletin Reflection

July 27, 2025

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

[GN 18:20-32; PS138:1-3, 6-8; COL 2:12-14; LK 11:1-13](#)

In our Gospel reading from Luke, some disciples of Jesus ask our Lord to teach them how to pray. Jesus instantly offers them the beautiful prayer which we, of course, call the Our Father.



The Our Father is truly a steward's prayer. In it, we call upon God in an intimate way, as Father. We ask that His will be done (not ours!) and that His kingdom come (not ours!). In other words, we remember that He is our Creator, everything is His, and our focus in life should be on His priorities, not our own. Then we ask Him to supply our needs (to give our daily bread), forgive our sins, and protect us from evil. That is, we proclaim our complete trust in His provision for us and mercy towards us. We, too, commit to extending mercy ourselves (as we forgive those who sin against us).

As we pray the words of the Our Father, we recognize this basic truth about ourselves and God: God is our Father, and we are beloved and infinitely blessed to be His children. This is the basis of a stewardship way of life.

At the end of the Gospel passage, Jesus encourages us to pursue a relationship with the Father: Ask Him, seek Him, knock on His door!

He can hardly wait to bless us, His children. Remember that this week, then go, be a blessing to others! Stewardship is just that simple..

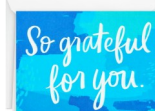

God blesses us constantly. One of those blessings in our lives are the people who extend God's grace and mercy to us each day. You are invited to take a little time to write someone a note this summer and send it to them. Let them know how grateful you are for them in your life. Perhaps you can invite them to mass or tell them how special they are. Note cards can be found on the coffee hour tables downstairs at St. Anthony or out in the narthex at Holy Innocents.



### Take God with You this Summer



Jesus himself taught us to approach God as Father. Each of these examples demonstrate how generous God is. They encourage us to trust in God to hear our needs and respond.

WE must never tire of expressing our needs in prayer. Let us be certain that we ask for what is right — what we need and not just for what we want.

### Family Reflection:

- As you pray the Our Father, choose one phrase that stands out for you? Explain why that is.
- What does it mean when we say forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us? What is a "trespass?"

### Faith in Action:

Jesus teaches us to pray in this week's Gospel. Talk candidly at home about your prayer life this week. When have you prayed? When do you pray? When have your prayers been answered in a way that you weren't expecting? *A reminder to parents: Just as Jesus learned to pray from his mother,*
