

### Baptism

The celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism for infants is scheduled after the baptismal preparation for the parents is completed. Baptisms are normally celebrated at a Sunday mass in the parish where the parents live. Adults (7 years or older) seeking baptism or confirmation are invited to inquire at the parish office for information about adult preparation.

### Marriage

Couples seeking marriage in the church are asked to contact the parish at least four months in advance of their proposed wedding date. For those with prior marriages, additional time may be required. Marriages are celebrated in the parish in which one of the Catholic parties lives.

### Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

Private confession is available every Friday evening 6:00 — 6:45 pm.

**Pastoral Care for the Sick and Dying** In the case of serious illness or failing health due to old age, parishioners should ask the church for the Sacrament of Anointing. This sacrament is administered by a priest and is celebrated by appointment as necessary. When a parishioner is near death, they should receive Holy Communion, called Viaticum (food for the journey). This sacrament can be administered by a priest or deacon or Eucharistic minister.



## Its Toiletries Time at the Food Pantry

The food pantry is in need of toiletry items this month. These would be things like shampoo, body wash, hand soap, shaving cream, razors and diaper wipes for the babies. You can drop your donations at the doors of the church, on Monday mornings between 9am—12noon or during office hours the rest of the week. Thank you for your donation.



## Stewardship Bulletin Reflection

**Fifth Sunday of Lent**  
[EZ 37:12-14; PS 130:1-8; ROM 8:8-11; JN 11:1-45 or](#)  
[JN 11:3-7, 20-27, 33b-45](#)

At this point in our Lenten journey, it is tempting to grow weary of the spiritual disciplines we have taken on. Today's readings inspire us to remain faithful, in grateful response to a God who loves us so much. I



In our first reading, the prophet Ezekiel speaks God's own words to us. "I will put my spirit in you that you may live... I have promised and I will do it, says the Lord." Our God wants to be so closely united to us that we are one with Him. And He has promised He will do it. But only if we make room for Him by making Him THE priority of our lives. Putting God first is a grateful response that is very pleasing to Him.

How can we do this? Our second reading, from Romans, tells us. "Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh... you are in the spirit if only the Spirit of God dwells in you."

The disciplines of Lent and a stewardship way of life are wonderful gifts that free us from too great an attachment to "the flesh." The sacrifices we make as Christian stewards are not meant to restrict our freedom and joy. Quite the contrary. They are tools to help us find the real freedom and joy that only come when we make room in our lives for God.

As we journey closer to the Passion of our Lord, let us intensify our Lenten resolutions and our stewardship way of life, inviting the Holy Spirit to take over more and more of our lives. By Easter, we will be freer to rejoice in Him and truly pleasing to God.

### St Vincent de Paul Holy Innocents Conference. Who are we?

Vincetians are volunteer members of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a large Catholic lay organization. We make home visits to comfort and help. We listen carefully and gather information needed to determine how we can best assist. Whether a neighbor needs assistance in paying rent, utilities, food, or emotional support and guidance or more, we are there.

Here's an example. A 74-year-old man, who, after losing his wife to cancer, plus having health issues including hospitalization, lost his home and all his possessions. When we were called, he was living in an RV without utilities. His son helped him find a low-income senior apartment to live in. He had funds to pay the deposit but needed funds for the first month's rent. HI SVDP paid the first month's rent. St Jude's SVDP helped with furniture and HI SVdP delivered it to his new apartment.
