ONE PARISH PLAN: NEXT STEPS FOR PARTNERS IN THE GOSPEL

Dear friends in Christ,
One of the basic principles of our faith is that we are all called to share in the mission of Christ to go make disciples. I have always emphasized that the role of a parish is to nurture and develop in each person a living relationship with Christ in the Church. This means that as a parish family, we are called to promote and facilitate encounters with Christ in our prayer, worship, teaching, passing on the faith, in our acts of service and in the way we promote community and fellowship. As our three churches of St. Jude, Holy Innocents and St. Anthony have come together, we are called as one body of Christ to do this together. We all have a role in building each other up as members of the body of Christ. This is essentially what the process of Partners in the Gospel is all about—coming together, working together to fulfill the mission Christ has given to the Church.

One Parish Planning

As part of Partners in the Gospel, the Archbishop has given to our three churches the mission of coming together as one parish and entrusted us with the task of figuring out how best to do this as we serve God and the people of Redmond, Duvall and Carnation. This is what the One Parish Planning process is all about. In the past year, we have been getting to know each other and working together in a number of concrete ways. This coming fall and throughout the rest of this year we will be engaging in a concerted effort of preparing this One Parish Plan. We will need your help and participation in this process. There will be surveys, listening sessions, and opportunities to provide your input. We very much will need that input—so I invite you to pay attention to the bulletin and announcements and to take an active part.

Here are some questions and answer about the process:

Q: Why One Parish Planning?

A: The One Parish Planning process will help parish families develop their vision and plan for how to re-envision parish life as they become one new canonical parish. All parish families in the archdiocese will be going through this process, and all parishioners will have the opportunity to participate.

Q: What is the timing for One Parish Planning?

A: This planning process will occur over these next 12 months to set the vision and plan for achieving it. This plan will outline activities and goals that can be achieved over the following five years once it is approved. The goal is to have the plan ready to submit next summer. This plan will outline activities and goals that can be accomplished over the following five years, once it is approved.

Q: Who is leading our Partners in the Gospel Process?

A: This process will be guided by the Parish Family Advisory Council and will act as the main consulting and working group for the pastor. They will be supported by the Parish Family Leadership Team comprised of staff from each parish, as well as support from Parish Liaisons and Chancery staff.

Q: How will people be involved in Partners in the Gospel?

A: This process is built on the foundational concept of co-responsibility, which means that all the baptized are responsible for the mission of the Church. Everyone in the parish family will have multiple opportunities to provide feedback, input and recommendations for how to re-envision parish life.

Q: What if we struggle to come to an agreement?

A: The Parish Family Advisory Council and Parish Family Leadership Team will use the input from parishioners to begin discerning the future. They will make recommendations and ultimately, after consultation and discernment, the pastor will make the final call on a topic that may not have clear consensus.

Q: How will decisions be communicated?

A: For each of the listening sessions, there will be an official synthesis of the feedback that was collected during the events that will be shared with the parish family. Additionally, as draft plans are created, they will be shared with the parish family for feedback. Be sure to read your parish family bulletin for updates.

Q: What happens once the Plan is turned in?

A: The One Parish Plan Review Committee will ensure the plan is complete and may request adjustments. Once approved, the plan will go to the archbishop. The archbishop will consult with the Presbyteral Council, after which he will either approve the plan or request further revisions.

This month will be providing you will more information on the schedule and events happen that will happen this fall. I invite you to please pray for our parish family and the fruitfulness of this process, that through it we may grow in faith, hope, and love and together accomplish the mission Christ has entrusted to us all.

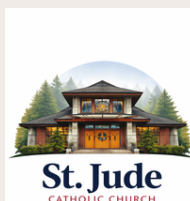

Feast Day Celebration

St. Jude Parish will celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Velankanni on Sunday, September 13, 2026 as part of the 11:00AM liturgical service. This beautiful celebration has become a cherished tradition in our community, drawing families from many churches across our area.

For over 400 years, the annual feast in India draws nearly 3 million pilgrims. In 1962, Pope John XXIII elevated the shrine to Basilica status, calling it the "Lourdes of the East." Today, Velankanni remains one of India's most visited religious sites, where Hindus, Muslims, and Christians worship together—a powerful symbol of faith, unity, and healing. STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION **EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME** IS 55:1-3; PS 145:8-9, 15-18; ROM 8:35, 37-39; MT 14:13-21



Today's readings should inspire the Christian steward with deepened gratitude for our God, who loves us with both fierce and tender love. We must make an intentional response each day, returning love for Love.

In our Second Reading from Romans, St. Paul reminds us that nothing and no one can separate us from the love of Christ. No anguish, distress, persecution, famine — and we might add illness, financial hardship, family struggles, or uncertainty about the future — nothing can keep our God from loving us. God holds us securely in the palm of His hand. And yet, this reassurance is only the beginning of God's gifts to us. Our Gospel from Matthew recounts the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish.

This miracle foreshadows the gift of the Eucharist, where Christ feeds us not simply with bread, but with His own Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. Notice how the Gospel begins. "His heart was moved with pity for them, and he cured their sick." What generous and compassionate love our Lord shows.

But even that is not enough for Him. He remains with the people, teaching and ministering to them until evening. When the disciples suggest sending the crowds away to find food, Jesus instead invites them to become part of His plan. He tells them to feed the people, then miraculously multiplies the few loaves and fish they offer.

What a privilege it was for the disciples to participate in Christ's work. That same privilege is ours as Christian stewards. Let us respond with grateful hearts to such amazing love.

As Catholics, we are called to deepen our relationship with Christ, and as missionary disciples, to invite others to grow in their relationship with Christ. We do this in many ways — one of which is through the local parish community. Our parishes are the primary way most Catholics stay connected to their faith and each other. The model of parish life also allows for great flexibility in meeting the needs of Catholics at different times in history.

Today we face many realities that are impacting parish life and making it difficult to fully live out our mission. We face an urgent — yet exciting — opportunity to transform parish life — and the faith of all those who live here.

Pope Francis calls us to “read the signs of the times” while adapting to both the needs of the faithful and to historical changes.

While there is no predetermined outcome for this strategic pastoral planning effort, together we will pray to the Holy Spirit to guide our efforts so that we may better support our mission to encounter Christ, accompany others and live the joy of the Gospel.

We are not the first diocese with the courage and the will to be creative with the structure of parish life. Many dioceses have gone before us and have provided models and lessons for how we too can use our limited resources to enhance the Catholic parish experience in the Archdiocese of Seattle.

Archbishop Etienne has appointed a team to lead this strategic pastoral planning work, which will bring most parishes together into a new family structure with two or more other parishes. The pastor, parish leaders and parishioners of the new parish family will determine how they will best join together to carry out the mission of the Church as one parish.

Here is a timeline of the key milestones for Partners in the Gospel:

- January 2023: Public launch
- Fall 2023: Invitation to provide input on parish families
- Early 2024: Final parish family structures announced
- July 2024: Parish families go into effect with one pastor
- 2024-2027: Parish families journey together to become one parish

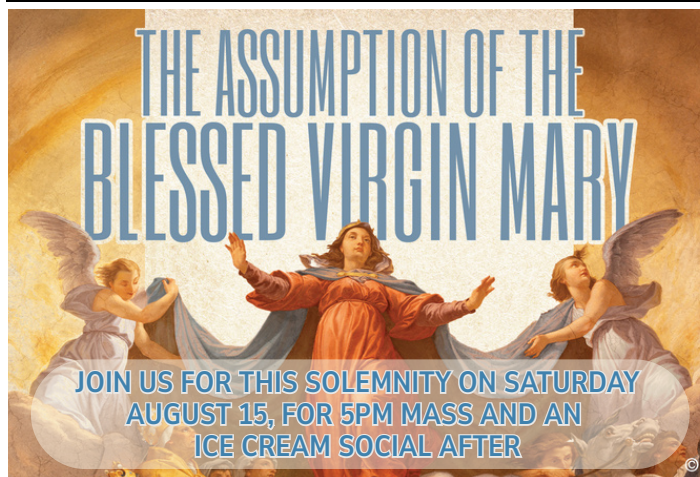

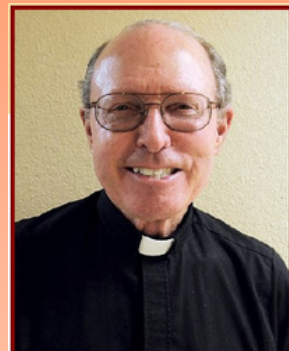
