Crowd Watches Hahn Golf Show

A large crowd turned out Monday to see "Golf's Greatest show", Paul Hahn, perform on the Hillview Country Club course. Hahn, combined a short golf clinic with a unique comedy routine including trick shots, with his many golf tricks and comedy routine. "Good golf is easy golf. . .that is a good golfer swings with no apparent effort, making it look easy" Hahn commented to start his clinic. However, the game of golf is contrary to our natural instincts and this fact alone frustrates many golfing novices.

"The grip is first in importance because through the hands we transmit both power and control. The most popular grip is the overlapping grip. The club shaft is extended diagonally across the lower part of the left hand and the upper part of the fingers of the left hand.

"When closing the hand on the shaft, three knuckles should be visible to the left eye when looking straight down. In the right hand the club is placed in the second knuckle joint of the middle three fingers with the little finger of the right hand overlapping the forefinger on the left hand. The club should be held firmly but not tightly, relaxed but not loose."

He showed the golf buffs other techniques of golf. Some of his tricks included hitting 250 yard shots with trick clubs, hitting three balls at once and hitting one from a chair.

Paul "Trick Shot Specialist" Hahn

Hillview Country Club has welcomed many memorable guests over the years, including legendary trick-shot golfer Paul Hahn, who brought "Golf's Greatest Show" to the Club. A large crowd gathered to watch Hahn combine a golf clinic with an entertaining comedy routine. This clinic/routine featured an incredible trick shot of driving a ball more than 250 yards with a head attached to clubs that were as long as a garden hose. He also performed tricks such as hitting three golf balls at once and striking a shot while seated in a chair.

Along with these tricks, Hahn shared instructions on the fundamentals of a golf swing, with emphasis on a proper grip being the foundation of a successful game. His visit gave Hillview members an unforgettable day of both education and entertainment.

Fun Fact: Hahn had to stop showcasing a particular trick shot, teeing off of his partner, due to individuals trying to recreate it with their own girlfriends!

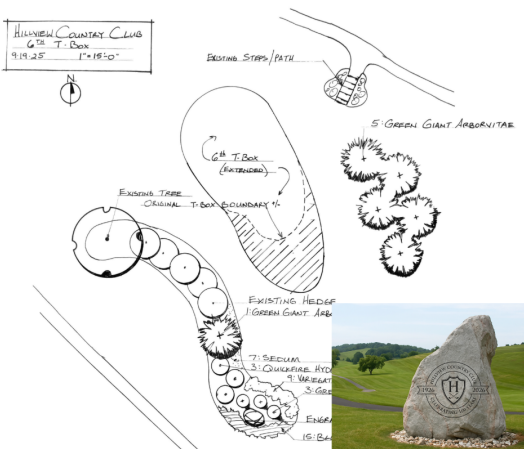


History Wall
