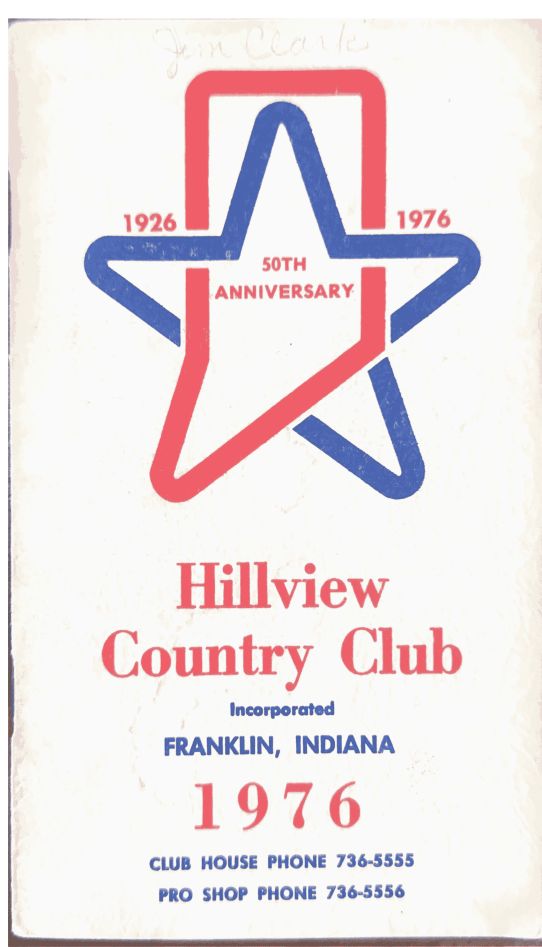
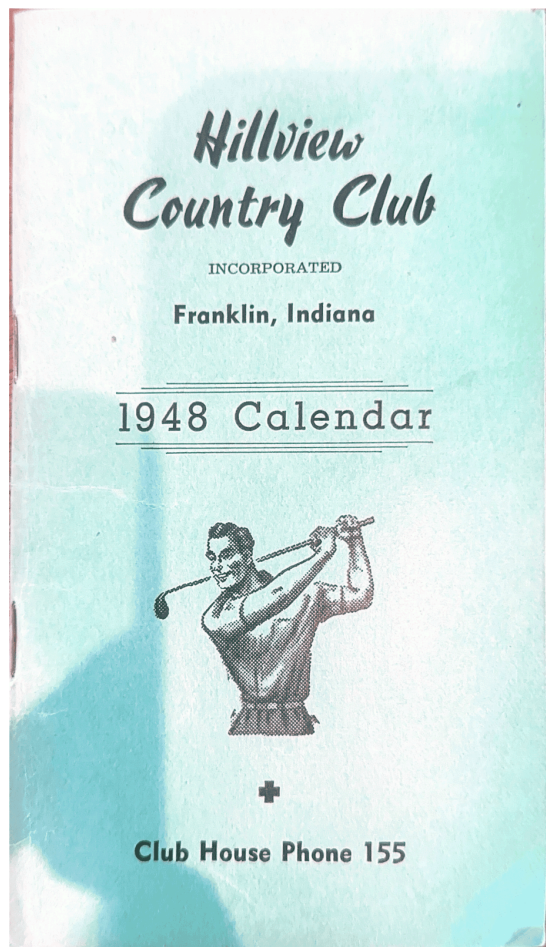

The Evolution of Hillview Country Club Committees

To our luck, the Club has retained a large collection of pocketbooks ranging from 1948 to 1976 (The 50th Anniversary of the Club). These pocketbooks hold a plethora of information, ranging from golf/social calendars to evolving rules & regulations, along with detailed membership directories. Perhaps the most intriguing are the differences in committees listed in the 1948 pocketbook vs. 1976. While the Club consistently operated under a Board of Directors until private ownership came into play in the 2010s, many social committees that reigned supreme in the early days of the Club dissipated long before the transfer of power.

For example, the 1948 pocketbook lists an entire page of

Entertainment Committees, including:

- Committee on Club Family Parties
- Committee on Mixed Bridge
- Committee on Stag Parties
- Committee on Club Dances
- Committee on Junior Parties
- Committee on Children's Activities

Each committee listed a Chairman and several committee members, who meticulously planned the annual social events for the calendar year. While the 1948 pocketbook maintained an extensive list of committees involved in the well-being of the Club, the 1976 Entertainment Committee was a single, straightforward group: The Social Committee, chaired by Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Maguire.

Fun Fact: The cover of the 1976 pocketbook sports the celebratory 50th Anniversary Logo of the Club.

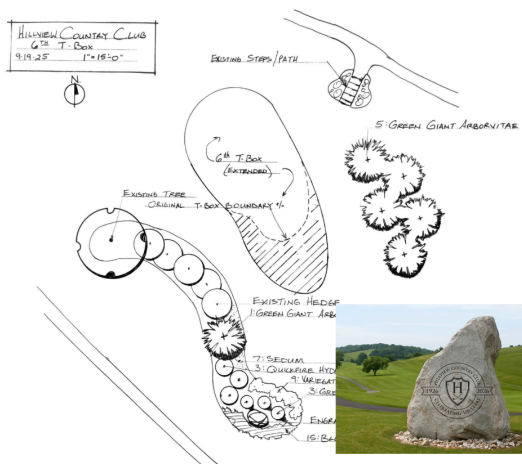


History Wall
