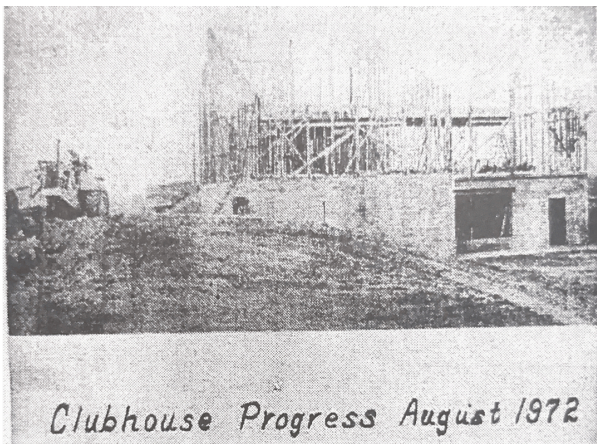

Following the fire that destroyed the original Clubhouse, the future of Hillview Country Club was uncertain; however, the Board of Directors at the time were a resilient group. They continued to improve the golf course by adding nine new holes and immediately started building a new Clubhouse. Finally, in December of 1972, the new Clubhouse opened and the Board turned their attention to building the Club that we all know and love today.

Fun Fact: During the Clubhouse rebuild, the Board bought two trailers to serve as a temporary Pro Shop and snack bar so that business could continue as usual.

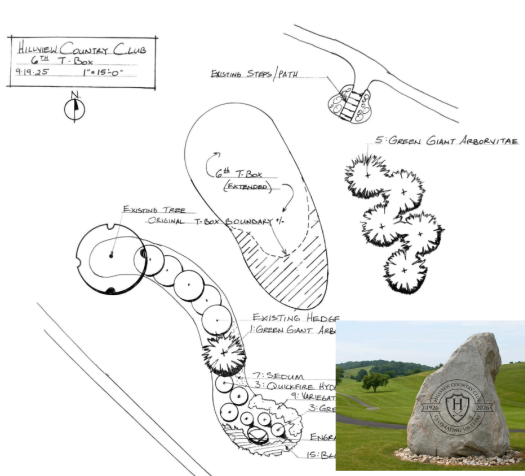


History Wall
