Newborn Kits

Global Health Ministries supports health care in resource-poor places. The gift of a GHM Newborn Kit is a blessing for the woman who receives it, providing basic items to help her clothe and care for her child, and celebrate new life! Importantly, the promise of this gift can also motivate her to connect with a health worker when she is expecting - a connection that can save her life. GHM sends Newborn Kits along with medical supplies and equipment to partners in Liberia, Madagascar, Tanzania, and Zimbabwe where they are used to encourage women to visit their local hospital or clinic for prenatal care and assisted delivery. Once that connection is made, mom is more likely to return for postnatal care, vaccinations for all her family and other health interventions - and to tell her friends and family they should do the same! The Newborn Kit is a blessing multiplier! This year, our goal is to send 20,000 Newborn Kits to waiting partners overseas.

We invite you to join others in our congregation in GHM's Newborn Kit Challenge this Advent and Christmas.

One Newborn Kit contains these items:

- 1 regular-size bath towel: lightweight, approx. 50" x 26"
- 1 washcloth: please not microfiber
- 1 bath-size bar white Ivory soap: in original packaging
- 1 newborn cotton t-shirt or "onesie"
 - o Size 0-3, or newborn
 - No need to cut off the bottom of a onesie
 - o Patterns for soft cotton shirts are also available on GHM's website
- 1 newborn stocking hat
 - o Small size, a newborn's head is about 14" circumference
 - Pattern suggestions for knit and crocheted hats are available on GHM's website
- 1 baby receiving blanket, between 30" x 30" and 48" x 48"
 - Soft cotton or medium-weight flannel
 - Note: knit or crocheted blankets are not included in Newborn Kits (they are sent separately to partner hospitals)
- 2 cloth pre-folded diapers
 - o Cotton with reinforced center panel, minimum size 12" x 16"
 - Gerber diapers online are a good source
 - o A pattern to make diapers from t-shirts or flannel is available on GHM's website
- 2 diaper pins: please no safety pins. Pin diaper pins onto diapers
