nally a reality. Rick Canfield and his crew from Palo Verde



Electric in Tucson installed the new wiring and interior fixtures to illuminate our magnificent windows at night, while also enhancing the Stations of the Cross statuary in the side aisles. The new state-of-the-art lighting panel was installed for safety reasons, but it also gives

us the capability to program the new lights to be on and off at specific times. We look forward to sharing the beautiful windows with visitors and locals for a period in the evening after dark.



I would like to

St. Patrick Church has always played a large role in the history of the Bisbee community. During the window restoration we were very much aware of the "historical pull" of the windows themselves. Our windows were designed and installed in approx. 1916 by the Emil Frei Art Glass Company, a company founded in 1898 by Emil Frei, a Bavarian immigrant whose family settled in St. Louis, Missouri and began the family owned and operated business designing, manufac-



turing and installing stained glass windows. Our restoration work 106 years later was supervised by Stephen Frei, the great-grandson of the company founder. The windows of St. Patrick Church are more than just windows. They are outstanding examples of




liturgical art, and we are pleased to share them with the community.

Our local St. Vincent de Paul Conference continues to provide rock solid support for our community. With our help, this year they've distributed food to nearly 4,000 people (translating to about 12,700 family members) and

provided close to \$9,800 in rent & utility assistance.

Since winter and cold weather (by Arizona standards) are upon us, remember that donations of coats, hats, gloves and blankets are needed and most welcome.

Bake sale fundraisers are held throughout the year; the Christmas sale will be December 14/15. WE ARE WORKING HARD TO MAKE OUR FLOCKNOTE NETWORK AS EFFECTIVE AS IT CAN BE. IF YOU ARE NOT CURRENTLY RECEIVING OUR FLOCKNOTES, WE ENCOURAGE YOU TO TRY. IF YOU KNOW SOMEONE WHO COULD / SHOULD BE RECEIVING THEM, PLEASE SHARE THIS INFORMATION.

WHAT ARE FLOCKNOTES?

A Flocknote is the way the parish communicates with you --- an electronic message that comes to you via your e-mail or in a text message. It is the best way we have to reach the most people in the least amount of time and much more inexpensively than a regular mailing. Our main weekly electronic bulletin usually goes out about 3 p.m. on Fridays.

IF YOU ARE SENDING THESE MESSAGES, WHY DON'T I GET THEM?

To reach you with a Flocknote, we must have either your email address or a cell phone number that can receive text messages. (If you have signed up but do not receive them, check your spam folder. Or call the parish office for assistance)

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW BEFORE I SIGN UP??

A few facts about our Flocknotes:

The parish does not charge anything for Flocknotes. This is a free service, but your telephone carrier message & data rates may apply.

If you sign up and later decide you don't want to receive Flocknotes any longer, just let us know. They will be stopped immediately, no questions asked.

You don't have to download anything, and you don't use a password. When you sign up, the messages come directly to you in your email or as a text.

You don't have to be a parishioner of St. Patrick Parish to receive our communications. Anyone may sign up.
