## FOSA NEWS

 Present Room Update – a slightly different (but still super fun!) way to shop this year 

This year our Present Room will operate slightly differently, every child still has a chance to visit and here's how it will work:

- Gifts are still £2 each and there's no limit to how many your child can buy.
- To avoid sending cash into school on multiple days, please pre-purchase gift labels and write them out at home.
- To do this, please complete the slip on the letter being sent out on Monday 10th November with how many gifts your child would like to buy. Please return to school by 14<sup>th</sup> November, and make the full payment on Bromcom.
- You will then receive an envelope on 17<sup>th</sup> November with the correct amount of labels inside for the presents your child wishes to purchase.
- Please write on the labels at home and return by 21<sup>st</sup> November in a sealed envelope with the following information:

- FOSA will then sort the envelopes into year groups and they will be ready in school for the children to visit the present room during their lunch break on their allocated day during the week beginning 24<sup>th</sup> November.

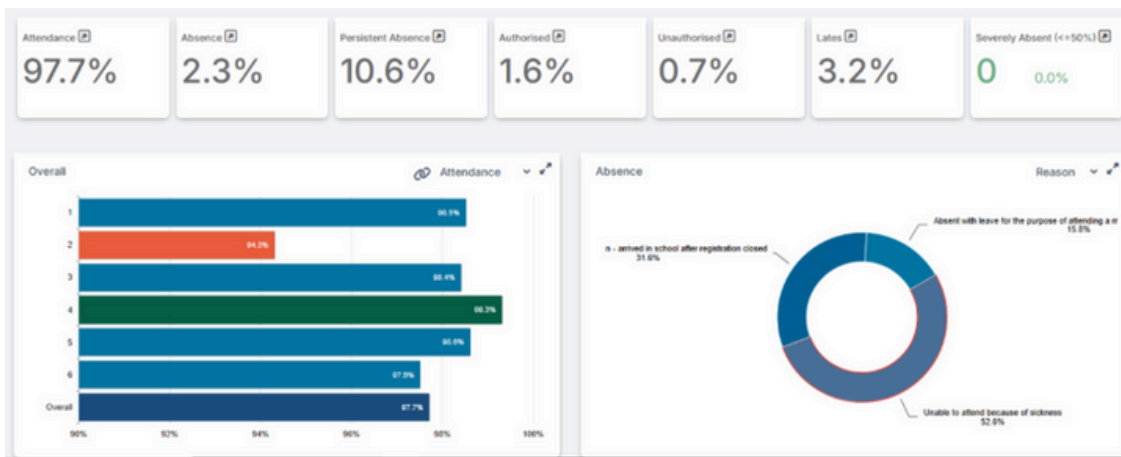
