Coach Steve Machen was a collegiate player, and college tennis coach for 18 years. During his coaching career, his team posted 6 consecutive conference title wins and competed at 8 national tournaments. Coach Machen is a certified tennis pro through the United States Professional Tennis Association (USPTA).

The tennis camp will offer 2 levels of instruction - intermediate and beginners. Each of the 2 levels will be taught separately.

TRACK & FIELD (CO-ED) Instructors: David Cain and NE AL area middle & high school coaches

David Cain is now in his 24th season as head coach of the UAH men's and women's cross country and track and field programs, assuming his role back in 1998. During Cain's tenure in Huntsville, he has established UAH as one of the premier cross country programs in Division II, and one of the most respectable track and field programs in the region. Cain, having built the track and field program from the ground up, led the men's and women's track and field programs to their back-to-back Peach Belt Conference titles in 2013 and 2014 prior to competing in the GSC in spring 2017. Since joining the GSC, Cain has guided the men's squad to back-toback championships while accumulating a total of 10 All-Americans over the past two seasons. A native of Huntsville, Cain graduated from Grissom High School where he lettered in track and cross country. His senior season he was named All-City and All-State in both sports, and finished second in the state in the two mile race. Coach Cain was inducted into the Madison County Hall of Fame in 2023.

Delaney Burnett was a Senior Captain of the Liberty University volleyball team. Her Junior year she was ASUN Setter of the Year and ranked third in the nation in assists. She graduated from Vandergrift High School in Austin, TX as a Three-Time All-State honoree and holds the career and single-season assists record for her high school.

#### Food

Lunch and unlimited water will be provided to each camper. Daily lunch menu is available at **northalabamafca.org** Campers are welcome to bring their own lunch, if desired.

**Dietary Needs:** Please direct food allergies, medicine and personal lunch boxes to the Camp Trainer.

All medicine should be placed in a ziplock bag with the campers name on it, and turned into the trainer.



### Equipment

Players are required to bring their own equipment (baseball; glove & bat, fishing; reel & life jacket, golf; clubs, lacrosse; lacrosse stick, soccer; shinguards - optional, softball; glove & bat, tennis - racquet.) If your child's sport is not listed, there is no equipment needed. Please put your child's name on <u>ALL</u> items. Each camper must provide his own shoes, socks, shorts and t-shirts.



#### Check-In

Check-in each morning will be at Whitesburg Baptist Church (ROC). Parents are not required to come in with your child. 8:00AM is the earliest a camper can be dropped off.



#### Pick-Up & Check-Out

The car pick-up sign is included for you to visibly place in the front window of your vehicle as you pick up your child in the specified car line. The car sign or picture ID is mandatory for camper pick-up. (Allow a 10 minute buffer when you arrive to check your child out as it takes time to get them from their huddle.

All early check-outs must be before 2:30PM. If you arrive after 2:30PM, we will direct you to the carline for pick-up.

#### Satety

- Cell phones are discouraged. If you feel your camper must have a cell phone, please advise him/her it should not be used without permission of an FCA huddle leader.
- Certified Athletic Trainer is provided by Huntsville Hospital Sports Center. Because of the rigorous schedule, each camper should come to camp in good physical condition. No flip flops or athletic sandals allowed.
- Due to the number of campers and planned schedules, personal camper phone calls are not allowed, except in the case of an emergency.
- In the case of an emergency, you may call the FCA Camp Office at 256-509-3692.
- Any serious violation of camp rules or regulations could result in immediate dismissal from camp.

### BASEBALL (BOYS)

Instructor: Will Noles and NE AL area middle & high school coaches

Will Noles is a Senior member of the University of Alabama Huntsville baseball team. He graduated from Westbrook Christian, where he helped lead his team to a State Championship. During his senior season, he was named second team CB High School All-State, First Team All-County and State Championship Tournament MVP. During his first year of college he was named GCS freshman of the week once. Will appeared in 32 games and started 26 times, batted .296 with four doubles and one home run, scored 21 runs, drove in 11 and had 13 walks to own a .410 on-base percentage. He plays the position of catcher/infielder. Will also serves on the UAH FCA Leadership Team; and, he has served as an FCA Summer Staff Intern three years.

BASKETBALL (CO-ED) Instructors: Tommy Murr and NE AL area middle & high school coaches

A legend in the state of Alabama, Murr attended Lindsay Lane Christian Academy (Athens, AL) where he was coached by his father - Steve Murr. He signed a scholarship with Lipscomb University and transferred to the University of Alabama, Huntsville last year. He is now a Senior and plays guard.

Coach Wyman was drafted in the 6th round (206th overall) of the 1996 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots. Prior to the 1999 NFL season the defensive tackle signed with the Minnesota Vikings and was allocated to NFL Europe to play for the Barcelona Dragons. Wyman signed with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2002, but did not play that season and left the team. On March 30, 2015 he was named head coach for the Texas Revolution of the Champions Indoor Football League. Devin Wyman has served with FCA sport camps for over a decade.
