QUALIFICATIONS

Nonpartisan Seat.

The candidate must be a citizen of the United States of America, a registered voter in Nassau County and must reside in the district at the time of qualifying. District school board members shall be elected at the general election in November for terms of 4 years, except that a person may not appear on the ballot for reelection, if by the end of his or her current term, the person will have served 8 consecutive years. Service of a term of office which commenced before 11/8/22 will not be counted toward the limitation. (FS 97.041, 99.021, 105.031, 1001.34, 1001.361, 1001.35, DE Guide 0008)

No officer (elected or appointed) may qualify as a candidate for another state, district, county, or municipal public office if the terms or any part thereof run concurrently with each other without resigning from the office he or she presently holds. If required, written resignations are due May 29, 2026 (at least ten days before the first day of the qualifying period for the intended office) and are irrevocable. (F.S. 99.012)

Refer to the Federal Hatch Act for additional qualifications and the Florida Commission on Ethics for potential conflict of interest.

FILING TO RUN FOR OFFICE

Forms required to open a campaign account

Form DS-DE 9, Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository, must be filed with the qualifying officer before opening a campaign bank account, accepting contributions, spending funds, or collecting petition signatures. Within ten days after filing Form DS-DE 9, the candidate must file Form DS-DE 84, Statement of Candidate, with the qualifying officer.
