### QUALIFICATIONS

Individuals seeking to qualify for nomination as a candidate of any political party shall affirm that they have not been a registered member of any other political party for 365 days before the beginning of qualifying preceding the General Election for which they seek to qualify. Individuals seeking to qualify as a candidate with no party affiliation must not be a member of any political party for the 365 days before the beginning of the applicable qualifying period. The deadline to change party affiliation is June 13, 2027. (FS 99.021)

The candidate must be a citizen of the United States of America, a registered voter in Nassau County and must reside in the county at the time of assuming office. (FS 97.041, 99.021, DE Guide 0008)

No officer (elected or appointed) may qualify as a candidate for another state, district, county, or municipal public office if the terms or any part thereof run concurrently with each other without resigning from the office he or she presently holds. If required, written resignations are due June 02, 2028 (at least ten days before the first day of the qualifying period for the intended office) and are irrevocable. (F.S. 99.012)

Refer to the Federal Hatch Act for additional qualifications and the Florida Commission on Ethics for potential conflicts of interest.

### FILING TO RUN FOR OFFICE

Forms required to open a campaign account

Form DS-DE 9, Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository, must be filed with the qualifying officer before opening a campaign bank account, accepting contributions, spending funds, or collecting petition signatures. Within ten days after filing Form DS-DE 9, the candidate must file Form DS-DE 84, Statement of Candidate, with the qualifying officer.
