## MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF

# THE CITY OF HOMEWOOD, ALABAMA

# July 12, 2021

The City Council of the City of Homewood, Alabama convened in Regular Session on Monday, July 12, 2021 at City Hall at 6:00 p.m.

The invocation was given by Couniclor Smith after which the pledge of allegiance was given.

The meeting was called to order by President Wyatt at 6:12 p.m.

Upon Roll Call, the following were present: Andy Gwaltney, Melanie Geer, Carlos Alemán, Andrew Wolverton, Nick Sims, Walter Jones, Barry Smith, Jalete Nelms, Jennifer Andress, John Hardin, and Alex Wyatt and constituting a quorum of Council members. Also present were: Mike Kendrick, City Attorney; and Melody Salter, City Clerk; J.J. Bischoff, Chief of Staff; and Mayor Patrick McClusky.

At this time, Councilor Smith moved to dispense with the reading of the Minutes of the Council Meeting of June 28, 2021 and approve them as presented. Councilor Gwaltney seconded the motion.
