

# UPSD Child Find Screening

2024-2025

**Purpose:** The purpose of the screening is to identify any skill deficits that may interfere with your child's learning, growth, and development. The screening is also provided to help parents identify their child's strengths and weaknesses as well as provide suggestions for at home. and to determine if a child needs further evaluation for special education eligibility.

**Who is Eligible?** We offer preschool screenings to all children between 3 and 5 years of age, living in the University Place School District, whose family or caregivers would like more information about their child's development. All school districts within Washington State have Child Find screenings available.

**What is Child Find Screening?** It is a free check of your child's development and skill level. Including:

- Large muscle development
- Eye-hand coordination (fine motor skills)
- Communication
- Concepts
- Personal-social skills
- Self-help skills
